narcissism Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external

objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.

pomposityThe quality of being pompous; self-importance.

His reputation for arrogance and **pomposity**.

prideBe proud of.

He swallowed his **pride** and asked for help.

proudly With pride; in a proud manner.

Ray watched **proudly** from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.
