Associations of "Self absorbed" (30 Words)

arrogance	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
centered	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He was puffed up with conceit.</i>
conceited	Excessively proud of oneself; vain. <i>Fred s so conceited he d never believe anyone would refuse him.</i>
ego	(in metaphysics) a conscious thinking subject. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentric	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric spatial perception.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	(ethics) the theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.
egoist	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
egotism	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
esprit	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
greed	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>Mercenaries who had allowed greed to overtake their principles.</i>
haughtiness	The appearance or quality of being arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i>Her air of haughtiness.</i>
hedonism	The pursuit of pleasure; sensual self-indulgence.

independent	An independent political candidate. <i>I wanted to remain independent in old age.</i>
individualism	The habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>A culture that celebrates individualism and wealth.</i>
individualist	A person who is independent and self-reliant. <i>Selfish individualists thinking only of themselves.</i>
individualistic	With minimally restricted freedom in commerce. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely individualistic.</i>
narcissism	Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.
pomposity	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
pride	Be proud of. <i>He swallowed his pride and asked for help.</i>
proudly	With pride; in a proud manner. <i>Ray watched proudly from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
smug	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling smug after his win.</i>
superego	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vainglory	Outspoken conceit. <i>His vainglory put the Republic at risk.</i>
vanity	Denoting a person or company publishing works at the author's expense. <i>A vanity press.</i>
