## Associations of "Self absorbed" (30 Words)

<b>arrogance</b>	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The <b>arrogance</b> of this man is astounding.</i>
<b>centered</b>	Being or placed in the center.
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He was puffed up with <b>conceit</b>.</i>
<b>conceited</b>	Excessively proud of oneself; vain. <i>Fred s so <b>conceited</b> he d never believe anyone would refuse him.</i>
<b>ego</b>	(in metaphysics) a conscious thinking subject. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b>egocentric</b>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> spatial perception.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	(ethics) the theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.
<b>egoist</b>	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
<b>egotism</b>	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>esprit</b>	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
<b>greed</b>	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>Mercenaries who had allowed <b>greed</b> to overtake their principles.</i>
<b>haughtiness</b>	The appearance or quality of being arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i>Her air of <b>haughtiness</b>.</i>
<b>hedonism</b>	The pursuit of pleasure; sensual self-indulgence.

<b>independent</b>	An independent political candidate. <i>I wanted to remain <b>independent</b> in old age.</i>
<b>individualism</b>	The habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>A culture that celebrates <b>individualism</b> and wealth.</i>
<b>individualist</b>	A person who is independent and self-reliant. <i>Selfish <b>individualists</b> thinking only of themselves.</i>
<b>individualistic</b>	With minimally restricted freedom in commerce. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely <b>individualistic</b>.</i>
<b>narcissism</b>	Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.
<b>pomposity</b>	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and <b>pomposity</b>.</i>
<b>pride</b>	Be proud of. <i>He swallowed his <b>pride</b> and asked for help.</i>
<b>proudly</b>	With pride; in a proud manner. <i>Ray watched <b>proudly</b> from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>smug</b>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling <b>smug</b> after his win.</i>
<b>superego</b>	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>
<b>vainglory</b>	Outspoken conceit. <i>His <b>vainglory</b> put the Republic at risk.</i>
<b>vanity</b>	Denoting a person or company publishing works at the author's expense. <i>A <b>vanity</b> press.</i>
