arrogance	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. The arrogance of this man is astounding.
<u>caustic</u>	A caustic substance. A <i>caustic</i> cleaner.
<u>centered</u>	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He was puffed up with conceit</i> .
corrode	Cause to deteriorate due to the action of water, air, or an acid. The self centred climate corrode s ideals and concerns about social justice.
corrosive	A corrosive substance. <i>Corrosive</i> cristism.
crushing	Physically or spiritually devastating; often used in combination. <i>The news came as a crushing blow.</i>
<u>ego</u>	(in metaphysics) a conscious thinking subject. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
<u>egocentric</u>	An egocentric person. Egocentric loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	(ethics) the theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.
egoist	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
egotism	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.
egotist	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
erosive	Wearing away by friction. The erosive effects of waves on the shoreline.



greed	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>Greed</i> has taken over football.
iconoclasm	The rejection or destruction of religious images as heretical; the doctrine of iconoclasts.
individualism	A belief in the importance of the individual and the virtue of self-reliance and personal independence. <i>A culture that celebrates individualism</i> and wealth.
individualist	Relating to or denoting a social theory favouring freedom of action for individuals over collective or state control. <i>Individualist attitudes.</i>
<u>individualistic</u>	Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional. An individualistic way of dressing.
narcissism	An exceptional interest in and admiration for yourself.
pomposity	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
<u>pride</u>	Confidence and self-respect as expressed by members of a group, typically one that has been socially marginalized, on the basis of their shared identity, culture, and experience. <i>I went to pride as a teenager before I was ready to come out.</i>
ruinous	Disastrous or destructive. A ruinous course of action.
selfish	(of a person, action, or motive) lacking consideration for other people; concerned chiefly with one's own personal profit or pleasure. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness</i> .
superego	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>The father is the model for the superego</i> .
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.
<u>vanity</u>	The quality of being worthless or futile. A vanity press.
vitriolic	Of a substance, especially a strong acid; capable of destroying or eating away by chemical action. <i>Vitriolic</i> attacks on the politicians.
