Associations of "Self destructive" (30 Words)

arrogance	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
caustic	A caustic substance. <i>A caustic cleaner.</i>
centered	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He was puffed up with conceit.</i>
corrode	Cause to deteriorate due to the action of water, air, or an acid. <i>The self centred climate corrodes ideals and concerns about social justice.</i>
corrosive	A corrosive substance. <i>Corrosive criticism.</i>
crushing	Physically or spiritually devastating; often used in combination. <i>The news came as a crushing blow.</i>
ego	(in metaphysics) a conscious thinking subject. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentric	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	(ethics) the theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.
egoist	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
egotism	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
erosive	Wearing away by friction. <i>The erosive effects of waves on the shoreline.</i>

greed	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>Greed has taken over football.</i>
iconoclasm	The rejection or destruction of religious images as heretical; the doctrine of iconoclasts.
individualism	A belief in the importance of the individual and the virtue of self-reliance and personal independence. <i>A culture that celebrates individualism and wealth.</i>
individualist	Relating to or denoting a social theory favouring freedom of action for individuals over collective or state control. <i>Individualist attitudes.</i>
individualistic	Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional. <i>An individualistic way of dressing.</i>
narcissism	An exceptional interest in and admiration for yourself.
pomposity	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
pride	Confidence and self-respect as expressed by members of a group, typically one that has been socially marginalized, on the basis of their shared identity, culture, and experience. <i>I went to pride as a teenager before I was ready to come out.</i>
ruinous	Disastrous or destructive. <i>A ruinous course of action.</i>
selfish	(of a person, action, or motive) lacking consideration for other people; concerned chiefly with one's own personal profit or pleasure. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
superego	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>The father is the model for the superego.</i>
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vanity	The quality of being worthless or futile. <i>A vanity press.</i>
vitriolic	Of a substance, especially a strong acid; capable of destroying or eating away by chemical action. <i>Vitriolic attacks on the politicians.</i>
