<b>arrogance</b>	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The <b>arrogance</b> of this man is astounding.</i>
<b>bragging</b>	Exhibiting or characterized by excessive pride or boastfulness. <i>A competitive <b>bragging</b> culture.</i>
<b><u>centered</u></b>	Being or placed in the center.
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The director s brilliant <b>conceit</b> was to film this tale in black and white.</i>
<b><u>ego</u></b>	A person’s sense of self-esteem or self-importance. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b><u>egocentric</u></b>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> spatial perception.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoist</b>	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
<b>egotism</b>	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>esprit</b>	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
<b>greed</b>	Intense and selfish desire for something, especially wealth, power, or food. <i><b>Greed</b> has taken over football.</i>
<b>individualism</b>	Self-centred feeling or conduct; egoism. <i>Encouragement has been given to <b>individualism</b> free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>

<b>individualist</b>	Relating to or characterized by the habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>An <b>individualistic</b> way of dressing.</i>
<b>individualistic</b>	With minimally restricted freedom in commerce. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely <b>individualistic</b>.</i>
<b>introspective</b>	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences. <i>He grew withdrawn and <b>introspective</b>.</i>
<b>modern</b>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>The pace of <b>modern</b> life.</i>
<b>narcissism</b>	Selfishness, involving a sense of entitlement, a lack of empathy, and a need for admiration, as characterizing a personality type.
<b>overambitious</b>	Excessively ambitious. <i>An <b>overambitious</b> expansion programme.</i>
<b>pomposity</b>	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>His reputation for arrogance and <b>pomposity</b>.</i>
<b>pride</b>	The trait of being spurred on by a dislike of falling below your standards. <i>The faces of the children s parents glowed with <b>pride</b>.</i>
<b>proudly</b>	In an imposing manner; splendidly. <i>Ray watched <b>proudly</b> from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>smug</b>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling <b>smug</b> after his win.</i>
<b>superego</b>	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>The father is the model for the <b>superego</b>.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>
<b>vainglory</b>	Outspoken conceit. <i>His <b>vainglory</b> put the Republic at risk.</i>
<b>vanity</b>	The quality of being worthless or futile. <i>A <b>vanity</b> press.</i>
