**egocentrism** Concern for your own interests and welfare.

**egoism** The theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.

**egoist** A self-centered person with little regard for others.

**egotism** An exaggerated opinion of your own importance.

*In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.* 

**eqotist** A conceited and self-centered person.

He is a self absorbed **egotist**.

Intense and selfish desire for something, especially wealth, power, or food.

The colonists **greed** for African land.

incredulity Doubt about the truth of something.

He stared down the street in **incredulity**.



Not disposed or willing to believe; unbelieving.

incredulous

An incredulous gasp.

individualist A person who pursues independent thought or action.

An individualistic way of dressing.

Cautious or wary due to realistic suspicions.

A city **leery** of gang violence.

**misgiving**Uneasiness about the fitness of an action.

We have **misgiving**s about the way the campaign is being run.

The trait of not trusting others.

The public **mistrust** of government.

narcissism Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external

objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.

Be especially proud of (a particular quality or skill.

In the **pride** of youth.

sceptical Marked by or given to doubt.

The public were deeply **sceptical** about some of the proposals.

Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion

**selfish** of others.

I joined them for **selfish** reasons.

**selfishness** The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people.

An act of pure **selfishness**.

**skeptic** Someone who habitually doubts accepted beliefs.

**superego**That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience.

The father is the model for the **superego**.

Doubt the genuineness or truth of.

The police have arrested a **suspect**.

Openly distrustful and unwilling to confide.

They are not treating the fire as **suspicious**.

vainglorious Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain.
