abhor	Regard with disgust and hatred. <i>He abhorred sexism in every form.</i>
abhorrence	Hate coupled with disgust. <i>The thought of marrying him filled her with abhorrence.</i>
abomination	Hate coupled with disgust. <i>A Calvinist abomination of indulgence.</i>
acrimony	Bitterness or ill feeling. <i>The AGM dissolved into acrimony.</i>
animosity	Strong hostility. <i>He no longer felt any animosity towards her.</i>
animus	Motivation to do something. <i>The author s animus towards her.</i>
arrogance	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
aversion	The act of turning yourself (or your gaze) away. <i>My dog s pet aversion is visitors particularly males.</i>
contempt	A manner that is generally disrespectful and contemptuous. <i>He was held in contempt.</i>
detest	Dislike intensely. <i>She detests politicians.</i>
detestation	Hate coupled with disgust. <i>Wordsworth s detestation of aristocracy.</i>
detested	Treated with contempt.
disaffection	The feeling of being alienated from other people. <i>There is growing disaffection with large corporations.</i>

discourtesy	Rude and inconsiderate behaviour. <i>The fact that MPs were not kept informed was an extraordinary discourtesy.</i>
disgust	A feeling of revulsion or strong disapproval aroused by something unpleasant or offensive. <i>They were disgusted by the violence.</i>
dislike	Have or feel a dislike or distaste for. <i>They had taken a dislike to each other.</i>
displeasure	The feeling of being displeased or annoyed or dissatisfied with someone or something. <i>Not for worlds would I do aught that might displeasure thee.</i>
egotism	An inflated feeling of pride in your superiority to others. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
enmity	A state or feeling of active opposition or hostility. <i>Decades of enmity between the two countries.</i>
execration	Hate coupled with disgust.
hate	An intensely disliked person or thing. <i>I hate to bother you.</i>
hostility	Acts of warfare. <i>He could no longer contain his hostility.</i>
loathing	Hate coupled with disgust. <i>The thought filled him with loathing.</i>
malice	The desire to harm someone; ill will. <i>I bear no malice towards anybody.</i>
misanthrope	A person who dislikes humankind and avoids human society. <i>Scrooge wasn't the mean spirited misanthrope most of us believe him to be.</i>
odium	General or widespread hatred or disgust incurred by someone as a result of their actions. <i>He incurred widespread odium for military failures and government corruption.</i>
repellent	Incapable of absorbing or mixing with. <i>She knew many repellents to his advances.</i>
selfishness	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
snide	Derogatory or mocking in an indirect way. <i>Makes many a sharp comparison but never a mean or snide one.</i>

umbrage Offence or annoyance.
*She took **umbrage** at his remarks.*
