abhor	Find repugnant. <i>He abhorred sexism in every form.</i>
abhorrence	Hate coupled with disgust. <i>The thought of marrying him filled her with abhorrence.</i>
abomination	A person who is loathsome or disgusting. <i>His treatment of the children is an abomination.</i>
animus	Motivation to do something. <i>The author s animus towards her.</i>
arrogance	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
aversion	A person or thing that arouses strong feelings of dislike. <i>They made plain their aversion to the use of force.</i>
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The architect s brilliant conceit was to build the house around the tree.</i>
detest	Dislike intensely. <i>She really did detest his mockery.</i>
detestation	A detested person or thing. <i>Wordsworth s detestation of aristocracy.</i>
dislike	Have or feel a dislike or distaste for. <i>She disliked any kind of unnecessary rudeness.</i>
displeasure	A feeling of annoyance or disapproval. <i>Not for worlds would I do aught that might displeasure thee.</i>
ego	An inflated feeling of pride in your superiority to others. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
egoist	A conceited and self-centered person.

egotism	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
execration	Hate coupled with disgust.
greed	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i>Mercenaries who had allowed greed to overtake their principles.</i>
hate	Feel intense dislike for. <i>Feelings of hate and revenge.</i>
hatred	Intense dislike; hate. <i>His murderous hatred of his brother.</i>
individualist	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>An individualistic way of dressing.</i>
odium	State of disgrace resulting from detestable behavior. <i>He incurred widespread odium for military failures and government corruption.</i>
pride	Be especially proud of (a particular quality or skill). <i>He takes pride in his son s success.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
superego	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
umbrage	Shade or shadow, especially as cast by trees. <i>She took umbrage at his remarks.</i>
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vanity	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited; false pride. <i>A vanity press.</i>
