<b>abhor</b>	Find repugnant. <i>He <b>abhorred</b> sexism in every form.</i>
<b><a href="#">abhorrence</a></b>	Hate coupled with disgust. <i>The thought of marrying him filled her with <b>abhorrence</b>.</i>
<b>abomination</b>	A person who is loathsome or disgusting. <i>His treatment of the children is an <b>abomination</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">animus</a></b>	Motivation to do something. <i>The author s <b>animus</b> towards her.</i>
<b>arrogance</b>	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The <b>arrogance</b> of this man is astounding.</i>
<b>aversion</b>	A person or thing that arouses strong feelings of dislike. <i>They made plain their <b>aversion</b> to the use of force.</i>
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The architect s brilliant <b>conceit</b> was to build the house around the tree.</i>
<b><a href="#">detest</a></b>	Dislike intensely. <i>She really did <b>detest</b> his mockery.</i>
<b>detestation</b>	A detested person or thing. <i>Wordsworth s <b>detestation</b> of aristocracy.</i>
<b>dislike</b>	Have or feel a dislike or distaste for. <i>She <b>disliked</b> any kind of unnecessary rudeness.</i>
<b><a href="#">displeasure</a></b>	A feeling of annoyance or disapproval. <i>Not for worlds would I do aught that might <b>displeasure</b> thee.</i>
<b><a href="#">ego</a></b>	An inflated feeling of pride in your superiority to others. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
<b>egoist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person.

<b>egotism</b>	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>execration</b>	Hate coupled with disgust.
<b>greed</b>	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i>Mercenaries who had allowed <b>greed</b> to overtake their principles.</i>
<b>hate</b>	Feel intense dislike for. <i>Feelings of <b>hate</b> and revenge.</i>
<b>hatred</b>	Intense dislike; hate. <i>His murderous <b>hatred</b> of his brother.</i>
<b>individualist</b>	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>An <b>individualistic</b> way of dressing.</i>
<b>odium</b>	State of disgrace resulting from detestable behavior. <i>He incurred widespread <b>odium</b> for military failures and government corruption.</i>
<b>pride</b>	Be especially proud of (a particular quality or skill). <i>He takes <b>pride</b> in his son s success.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>superego</b>	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.</i>
<b>umbrage</b>	Shade or shadow, especially as cast by trees. <i>She took <b>umbrage</b> at his remarks.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>
<b>vanity</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited; false pride. <i>A <b>vanity</b> press.</i>
