## Associations of "Self made" (30 Words)

<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The architect s brilliant <b>conceit</b> was to build the house around the tree.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create by artistic means. <i>The company was <b>created</b> 25 years ago.</i>
<b>creation</b>	(theology) God’s act of bringing the universe into existence. <i>She treats fictional <b>creations</b> as if they were real people.</i>
<b>creative</b>	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>A <b>creative</b> team of designers.</i>
<b>creativity</b>	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage <b>creativity</b>.</i>
<b><u>ego</u></b>	Your consciousness of your own identity. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b><u>egocentric</u></b>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
<b>egoist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person.
<b>egotism</b>	An inflated feeling of pride in your superiority to others. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Concoct something artificial or untrue. <i>The company <b>fabricates</b> plastic chairs.</i>
<b>figment</b>	A contrived or fantastic idea. <i>It really was Ross and not a <b>figment</b> of her overheated imagination.</i>

<b><u>forge</u></b>	Make something, usually for a specific function. <i>She <b>forged</b> a Green Card.</i>
<b>greed</b>	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i><b>Greed</b> has taken over football.</i>
<b><u>imagination</u></b>	The part of the mind that imagines things. <i>Popular <b>imagination</b> created a world of demons.</i>
<b>independent</b>	An independent political candidate. <i>The legislature and the judicature are <b>independent</b> of one another.</i>
<b><u>individualistic</u></b>	Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely <b>individualistic</b>.</i>
<b>innovation</b>	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i><b>Innovation</b> is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.</i>
<b><u>invention</u></b>	A creation (a new device or process) resulting from study and experimentation. <i>His powers of <b>invention</b> were rather limited.</i>
<b><u>inventive</u></b>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>The most <b>inventive</b> composer of his time.</i>
<b><u>modern</u></b>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i><b>Modern</b> history.</i>
<b><u>original</u></b>	An original creation i.e. an audio recording from which copies can be made. <i>The <b>original</b> performance of the opera.</i>
<b><u>pride</u></b>	A feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own achievements, the achievements of those with whom one is closely associated, or from qualities or possessions that are widely admired. <i>The swimming pool is the <b>pride</b> of the community.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>superego</b>	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>

Excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance or achievements.

The **vanity** of human wishes.
