conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The architect s brilliant conceit was to build the house around the tree.</i>
create	Create by artistic means. <i>The company was created 25 years ago.</i>
creation	(theology) God’s act of bringing the universe into existence. <i>She treats fictional creations as if they were real people.</i>
creative	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>A creative team of designers.</i>
creativity	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
ego	Your consciousness of your own identity. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentric	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
egoist	A conceited and self-centered person.
egotism	An inflated feeling of pride in your superiority to others. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
fabricate	Concoct something artificial or untrue. <i>The company fabricates plastic chairs.</i>
figment	A contrived or fantastic idea. <i>It really was Ross and not a figment of her overheated imagination.</i>

<u>forge</u>	Make something, usually for a specific function. <i>She forged a Green Card.</i>
greed	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i>Greed has taken over football.</i>
<u>imagination</u>	The part of the mind that imagines things. <i>Popular imagination created a world of demons.</i>
independent	An independent political candidate. <i>The legislature and the judicature are independent of one another.</i>
<u>individualistic</u>	Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely individualistic.</i>
innovation	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i>Innovation is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.</i>
<u>invention</u>	A creation (a new device or process) resulting from study and experimentation. <i>His powers of invention were rather limited.</i>
<u>inventive</u>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>The most inventive composer of his time.</i>
<u>modern</u>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Modern history.</i>
<u>original</u>	An original creation i.e. an audio recording from which copies can be made. <i>The original performance of the opera.</i>
<u>pride</u>	A feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own achievements, the achievements of those with whom one is closely associated, or from qualities or possessions that are widely admired. <i>The swimming pool is the pride of the community.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
superego	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>

Excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance or achievements.
