## Associations of "Self pity" (30 Words)

<b>arrogance</b>	The quality of being arrogant. <i>The <b>arrogance</b> of this man is astounding.</i>
<b>bragging</b>	Exhibiting or characterized by excessive pride or boastfulness. <i>A competitive <b>bragging</b> culture.</i>
<b>centered</b>	Being or placed in the center.
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The director s brilliant <b>conceit</b> was to film this tale in black and white.</i>
<b>conceited</b>	Excessively proud of oneself; vain. <i>Fred s so <b>conceited</b> he d never believe anyone would refuse him.</i>
<b>ego</b>	(in metaphysics) a conscious thinking subject. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b>egocentric</b>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person.
<b>egotism</b>	An exaggerated opinion of your own importance. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>esprit</b>	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
<b>greed</b>	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i><b>Greed</b> has taken over football.</i>
<b>haughtiness</b>	The appearance or quality of being arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i>Her air of <b>haughtiness</b>.</i>

<b>hubris</b>	Overbearing pride or presumption. <i>The self assured <b>hubris</b> among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.</i>
<b>individualism</b>	A belief in the importance of the individual and the virtue of self-reliance and personal independence. <i>Encouragement has been given to <b>individualism</b> free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
<b>individualist</b>	A self-centred or egotistical person. <i><b>Individualist</b> capitalism.</i>
<b>individualistic</b>	Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely <b>individualistic</b>.</i>
<b>introspective</b>	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences. <i>He grew withdrawn and <b>introspective</b>.</i>
<b>narcissism</b>	Excessive interest in or admiration of oneself and one's physical appearance.
<b>pomposity</b>	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>His reputation for arrogance and <b>pomposity</b>.</i>
<b>pride</b>	A person or thing that arouses a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction. <i>A celebration of Latino <b>pride</b>.</i>
<b>proudly</b>	In an imposing manner; splendidly. <i>Pristine new office buildings stood <b>proudly</b> beside a large car park.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>superego</b>	(psychoanalysis) that part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>The father is the model for the <b>superego</b>.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Feeling self-importance. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>
<b>vainglory</b>	Excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements; excessive vanity. <i>His <b>vainglory</b> put the Republic at risk.</i>
<b>vanity</b>	Excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance or achievements. <i>A <b>vanity</b> press.</i>
