bluff	The act of bluffing in poker deception by a false show of confidence in the strength of your cards. <i>There s no point in trying to <b>bluff</b> it out.</i>
bragging	An instance of boastful talk. She interrupted their endless <b>bragging</b> .
<u>centered</u>	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. He is alarmed by the widespread <b>conceit</b> that he spent most of the 1980s drunk.
<u>ego</u>	The conscious mind. He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b> .
<u>egocentric</u>	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric</i> spatial perception.
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoist	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
egotism	An exaggerated opinion of your own importance. In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.
egotist	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self- seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
esprit	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
greed	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>The colonists <b>greed</b> for African land</i> .



haughtiness	The appearance or quality of being arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i>Her air of <b>haughtiness</b>.</i>
individual	Characteristic of or meant for a single person or thing. An <b>individual</b> serving.
individualism	A social theory favouring freedom of action for individuals over collective or state control. Encouragement has been given to <b>individualism</b> free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.
individualist	Relating to or characterized by the habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>Individualist capitalism.</i>
<u>individualistic</u>	With minimally restricted freedom in commerce. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely</i> <b>individualistic</b> .
narcissism	Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.
overambitious	Excessively ambitious. <i>He blamed his parents for being <b>overambitious</b> on his behalf.</i>
pomposity	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and <b>pomposity</b>.</i>
<u>pride</u>	A group of lions. The faces of the children s parents glowed with <b>pride</b> .
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness</i> .
<u>smug</u>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. A <b>smug</b> glow of self congratulation.
superego	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.
vainglorious	Feeling self-importance. This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.
vainglory	Outspoken conceit. His <b>vainglory</b> put the Republic at risk.
<u>vanity</u>	Excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance or achievements. The <b>vanity</b> of human wishes.
