<b>arrogance</b>	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The <b>arrogance</b> of this man is astounding.</i>
<b>bluff</b>	The act of bluffing in poker deception by a false show of confidence in the strength of your cards. <i>There s no point in trying to <b>bluff</b> it out.</i>
<b>bragging</b>	An instance of boastful talk. <i>She interrupted their endless <b>bragging</b>.</i>
<b>centered</b>	Being or placed in the center.
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He is alarmed by the widespread <b>conceit</b> that he spent most of the 1980s drunk.</i>
<b>ego</b>	The conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b>egocentric</b>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> spatial perception.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoist</b>	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
<b>egotism</b>	An exaggerated opinion of your own importance. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>esprit</b>	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
<b>greed</b>	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>The colonists <b>greed</b> for African land.</i>

<b>haughtiness</b>	The appearance or quality of being arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i>Her air of <b>haughtiness</b>.</i>
<b>individual</b>	Characteristic of or meant for a single person or thing. <i>An <b>individual</b> serving.</i>
<b>individualism</b>	A social theory favouring freedom of action for individuals over collective or state control. <i>Encouragement has been given to <b>individualism</b> free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
<b>individualist</b>	Relating to or characterized by the habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i><b>Individualist</b> capitalism.</i>
<b>individualistic</b>	With minimally restricted freedom in commerce. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely <b>individualistic</b>.</i>
<b>narcissism</b>	Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.
<b>overambitious</b>	Excessively ambitious. <i>He blamed his parents for being <b>overambitious</b> on his behalf.</i>
<b>pomposity</b>	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and <b>pomposity</b>.</i>
<b>pride</b>	A group of lions. <i>The faces of the children's parents glowed with <b>pride</b>.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>smug</b>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>A <b>smug</b> glow of self congratulation.</i>
<b>superego</b>	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Feeling self-importance. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>
<b>vainglory</b>	Outspoken conceit. <i>His <b>vainglory</b> put the Republic at risk.</i>
<b>vanity</b>	Excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance or achievements. <i>The <b>vanity</b> of human wishes.</i>
