Associations of "Self righteous" (30 Words)

arrogance	The quality of being arrogant. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
bragging	An instance of boastful talk. <i>We became involved in a lively bragging session.</i>
<u>centered</u>	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He is alarmed by the widespread conceit that he spent most of the 1980s drunk.</i>
<u>ego</u>	(psychoanalysis) the conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
<u>egocentric</u>	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	(ethics) the theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.
egoist	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
egotism	An exaggerated opinion of your own importance. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
esprit	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
greed	Intense and selfish desire for something, especially wealth, power, or food. <i>The colonists greed for African land.</i>
haughtiness	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>Her air of haughtiness.</i>

individualism	A belief in the importance of the individual and the virtue of self-reliance and personal independence. <i>Encouragement has been given to individualism free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
individualist	A person who is independent and self-reliant. <i>A rugged individualist driven to succeed.</i>
individualistic	Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional. <i>Her work is quirky and genuinely individualistic.</i>
introspective	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences. <i>He grew withdrawn and introspective.</i>
narcissism	Excessive interest in or admiration of oneself and one's physical appearance.
overambitious	Excessively ambitious. <i>An overambitious expansion programme.</i>
pomposity	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
pride	A feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own achievements, the achievements of those with whom one is closely associated, or from qualities or possessions that are widely admired. <i>He takes pride in his son's success.</i>
proudly	In an imposing manner; splendidly. <i>Ray watched proudly from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
smug	Having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements. <i>He was feeling smug after his win.</i>
superego	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vainglory	Excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements; excessive vanity. <i>His vainglory put the Republic at risk.</i>
