centered	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The idea of the wind's singing is a prime romantic conceit.</i>
ego	Your consciousness of your own identity. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentric	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric spatial perception.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.

egoist	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
egotism	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
esprit	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
greed	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i>Greed has taken over football.</i>
haughtiness	The appearance or quality of being arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i>Her air of haughtiness.</i>

hedonism	The pursuit of pleasure as a matter of ethical principle.
individualist	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>A rugged individualist driven to succeed.</i>
individualistic	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>An individualistic way of dressing.</i>
introspective	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences. <i>He grew withdrawn and introspective.</i>
narcissism	Selfishness, involving a sense of entitlement, a lack of empathy, and a need for admiration, as characterizing a personality type.
pomposity	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
pride	Consciousness of one's own dignity. <i>He takes great pride in his appearance.</i>
proudly	In an imposing manner; splendidly. <i>She proudly displayed her newest creations.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
smug	Having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements. <i>A smug glow of self congratulation.</i>
superego	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>The father is the model for the superego.</i>
vainglorious	Feeling self-importance. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vainglory	Excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements; excessive vanity. <i>His vainglory put the Republic at risk.</i>
vanity	Feelings of excessive pride. <i>A vanity press.</i>
