<b>arrogance</b>	The quality of being arrogant. <i>The <b>arrogance</b> of this man is astounding.</i>
<b>boast</b>	Show off. <i>I said I would win and it wasn't an idle <b>boast</b>.</i>
<b>bragging</b>	Exhibiting self-importance. <i>We became involved in a lively <b>bragging</b> session.</i>
<b>centered</b>	Being or placed in the center.
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The idea of the wind's singing is a prime romantic <b>conceit</b>.</i>
<b>ego</b>	Your consciousness of your own identity. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b>egocentric</b>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> spatial perception.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoist</b>	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
<b>egotism</b>	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>esprit</b>	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
<b>greed</b>	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i><b>Greed</b> has taken over football.</i>
<b>haughtiness</b>	The appearance or quality of being arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i>Her air of <b>haughtiness</b>.</i>

<b>hedonism</b>	The pursuit of pleasure as a matter of ethical principle.
<b>individualist</b>	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>A rugged <b>individualist</b> driven to succeed.</i>
<b>individualistic</b>	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>An <b>individualistic</b> way of dressing.</i>
<b>introspective</b>	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences. <i>He grew withdrawn and <b>introspective</b>.</i>
<b>narcissism</b>	Selfishness, involving a sense of entitlement, a lack of empathy, and a need for admiration, as characterizing a personality type.
<b>pomposity</b>	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>His reputation for arrogance and <b>pomposity</b>.</i>
<b>pride</b>	Consciousness of one's own dignity. <i>He takes great <b>pride</b> in his appearance.</i>
<b>proudly</b>	In an imposing manner; splendidly. <i>She <b>proudly</b> displayed her newest creations.</i>
<b>selfish</b>	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>smug</b>	Having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements. <i>A <b>smug</b> glow of self congratulation.</i>
<b>superego</b>	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>The father is the model for the <b>superego</b>.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Feeling self-importance. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>
<b>vainglory</b>	Excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements; excessive vanity. <i>His <b>vainglory</b> put the Republic at risk.</i>
<b>vanity</b>	Feelings of excessive pride. <i>A <b>vanity</b> press.</i>
