Associations of "Self sufficient" (30 Words)

arrogance	The quality of being arrogant. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
bragging	Exhibiting or characterized by excessive pride or boastfulness. <i>We became involved in a lively bragging session.</i>
<u>centered</u>	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He is alarmed by the widespread conceit that he spent most of the 1980s drunk.</i>
<u>condescending</u>	(used of behavior or attitude) characteristic of those who treat others with condescension. <i>A condescending smile.</i>
<u>ego</u>	The conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
<u>egocentric</u>	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
egoist	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
egotism	An exaggerated opinion of your own importance. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
esprit	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
greed	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>Greed has taken over football.</i>

haughtiness	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>Her air of haughtiness.</i>
individualism	A social theory favouring freedom of action for individuals over collective or state control. <i>A culture that celebrates individualism and wealth.</i>
individualist	A person who is independent and self-reliant. <i>An individualistic way of dressing.</i>
individualistic	Marked by or expressing individuality. <i>An individualistic way of dressing.</i>
modern	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Modern history.</i>
narcissism	An exceptional interest in and admiration for yourself.
overambitious	Excessively ambitious. <i>He blamed his parents for being overambitious on his behalf.</i>
pomposity	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
pride	A feeling of self-respect and personal worth. <i>He prided himself on his honesty.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
smug	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling smug after his win.</i>
superego	(psychoanalysis) that part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vainglory	Outspoken conceit. <i>His vainglory put the Republic at risk.</i>
vanity	The quality of being valueless or futile. <i>The vanity of human wishes.</i>
