absenteeism	Habitual absence from work. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
arrogance	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
bragging	Exhibiting or characterized by excessive pride or boastfulness. <i>A little honest bragging doesn't hurt anyone.</i>
centered	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The director's brilliant conceit was to film this tale in black and white.</i>
ego	(psychoanalysis) the conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentric	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric spatial perception.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	(ethics) the theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.
egoist	A conceited and self-centered person.
egotism	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
esprit	The quality of being lively, vivacious, or witty.
greed	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i>Greed has taken over football.</i>

individualism	The quality of being individual. <i>Encouragement has been given to individualism free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
individualist	A person who is independent and self-reliant. <i>Selfish individualists thinking only of themselves.</i>
individualistic	More interested in individual people than in society as a whole. <i>Individualistic cultures where individuals strive for self realization.</i>
introspective	Characterized by or given to introspection. <i>He grew withdrawn and introspective.</i>
modern	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>They do not have modern weapons.</i>
morale	The spirit of a group that makes the members want the group to succeed. <i>The team s morale was high.</i>
narcissism	Selfishness, involving a sense of entitlement, a lack of empathy, and a need for admiration, as characterizing a personality type.
pedagogy	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language pedagogy.</i>
pomposity	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
pride	A public event, typically involving a parade, held to celebrate LGBT identities, culture, and experience. <i>The males in the pride are very tolerant towards all the cubs.</i>
selfish	(of a person, action, or motive) lacking consideration for other people; concerned chiefly with one's own personal profit or pleasure. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
superego	(psychoanalysis) that part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
vainglorious	Excessively proud of oneself or one's achievements; overly vain. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vainglory	Excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements; excessive vanity. <i>His vainglory put the Republic at risk.</i>
vanity	The quality of being valueless or futile. <i>A vanity press.</i>
