individualistic Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional.

narcissism Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external

objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.

pomposity The quality of being pompous; self-importance.

His reputation for arrogance and **pomposity**.

Consciousness of one's own dignity.

The team was bursting with **pride** after recording a sensational victory.

With a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction in one's own achievements,

qualities, or possessions or those of someone with whom one is closely

proudly associated.
