Associations of "Self worth" (30 Words)

arrogance	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>The arrogance of this man is astounding.</i>
boast	Talk with excessive pride and self-satisfaction about one’s achievements, possessions, or abilities. <i>The hotel boasts high standards of comfort.</i>
bragging	Exhibiting self-importance. <i>We became involved in a lively bragging session.</i>
centered	Being or placed in the center.
conceit	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>He was puffed up with conceit.</i>
ego	(psychoanalysis) the conscious mind. <i>He needed a boost to his ego.</i>
egocentric	An egocentric person. <i>Egocentric loners with an overinflated sense of self worth.</i>
egocentrism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
egoism	The theory that the pursuit of your own welfare in the basis of morality.
egoist	A conceited and self-centered person.
egotism	An exaggerated opinion of your own importance. <i>In his arrogance and egotism he underestimated Gill.</i>
egotist	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed egotist.</i>
esprit	Liveliness of mind or spirit.
esteem	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>I should esteem it a favour if you could speak to them.</i>
greed	Intense and selfish desire for something, especially wealth, power, or food. <i>The colonists greed for African land.</i>

individualism	The habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>Encouragement has been given to individualism free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
individualist	A self-centred or egotistical person. <i>Individualist capitalism.</i>
individualistic	Marked by or expressing individuality; unconventional. <i>An individualistic way of dressing.</i>
introspective	Characterized by or given to introspection. <i>He grew withdrawn and introspective.</i>
narcissism	Self-centredness arising from failure to distinguish the self from external objects, either in very young babies or as a feature of mental disorder.
pomposity	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and pomposity.</i>
pride	Consciousness of one's own dignity. <i>The team was bursting with pride after recording a sensational victory.</i>
proudly	With a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction in one's own achievements, qualities, or possessions or those of someone with whom one is closely associated. <i>Ray watched proudly from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
sanctimonious	Making a show of being morally superior to other people. <i>What happened to all the sanctimonious talk about putting his family first.</i>
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman. <i>I joined them for selfish reasons.</i>
selfishness	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
smug	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>A smug glow of self congratulation.</i>
superego	The part of a person's mind that acts as a self-critical conscience, reflecting social standards learned from parents and teachers. <i>The father is the model for the superego.</i>
vainglorious	Feeling self-importance. <i>This vainglorious boast of personal infallibility.</i>
vanity	Feelings of excessive pride. <i>The vanity of human wishes.</i>
