
Selfless as an Adjective

A benevolent contributor.

benignity The quality of being kind and gentle.

His air of **benignity**.

bounteous Given or giving freely.

The **bounteous** goodness of God.

Relating to or characterized by charity.

charitableCharitable to the poor.

Careful not to inconvenience or harm others.

Friends **considerate** enough to leave us alone.

A short message (as in a book or musical work or on a photograph)

<u>dedication</u> dedicating it to someone or something.

A faintly engraved inscription or **dedication**.

devotion Love, loyalty, or enthusiasm for a person or activity.

His **devotion** to duty never wavered.

An impurity atom in a semiconductor which contributes a conducting

donor electron to the material.

A blood **donor**.

eleemosynary Generous in assistance to the poor.

Eleemosynary relief.

... Acting generously.

Not petty in character and mind.

A generous assessment of his work.

giver A person who gives something.

A **giver** of advice.

humane (of a branch of learning) intended to have a civilizing effect on people.

The **humane** education of literary study.

A category of things distinguished by some common characteristic or

Kind to sick patients.

leniency Mercifulness as a consequence of being lenient or tolerant.

The court could show **leniency**.

Be enamored or in love with.

Children need a lot of **love**.



magnanimous Generous and understanding and tolerant.

She should be **magnanimous** in victory.

Leniency and compassion shown toward offenders by a person or agency

mercy charged with administering justice.

He threw himself on the **mercy** of the court.

mildness Lack of severity.

The **mildness** of his manner and his desire to please everyone.

Characterized by or displaying great generosity.

munificent

A munificent bequest.

(of a person or organization) seeking to promote the welfare of others;

philanthropic generous and benevolent.

They receive financial support from **philanthropic** bodies.

Tolerant and forgiving under provocation.

These fish are quite **tolerant** as long as extremes of pH are avoided.

(especially of an emotion) lasting forever.

undying His undying fame.

willing to put the needs or wishes of others before one's own.

Unselfish devotion.

unstinting Given or giving without restraint; unsparing.

Called for **unstinting** aid to Britain.

wholehearted Showing or characterized by complete sincerity and commitment.

Gave **wholehearted** support to her candidacy.
