Definitions of "Selfless" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “selfless” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Showing unselfish concern for the welfare of others.*
- *Concerned more with the needs and wishes of others than with one's own; unselfish.*



Synonyms of "Selfless" as an adjective (4 Words)

altruistic	Showing a disinterested and selfless concern for the well-being of others; unselfish. <i>It was an entirely altruistic act.</i>
self-denying	Willing to deprive yourself.
self-sacrificing	Willing to deprive yourself.
<u>unselfish</u>	Disregarding your own advantages and welfare over those of others. <i>Unselfish devotion.</i>



Usage Examples of "Selfless" as an adjective

- *An act of selfless devotion.*



Associations of "Selfless" (30 Words)

- alms** (in historical contexts) money or food given to poor people.
*The riders stopped to distribute **alms**.*
- altruistic** Showing a disinterested and selfless concern for the well-being of others; unselfish.
*I question how **altruistic** his motives were.*
- benefactor** A person who gives money or other help to a person or cause.
*A low interest loan from a **benefactor** allowed them to build a floor for the exhibition hall.*
- beneficent** Doing or producing good.
*A **beneficent** democracy.*

benevolent	(of an organization) serving a charitable rather than a profit-making purpose. A benevolent contributor.
benignity	The quality of being kind and gentle. <i>His air of benignity.</i>
bounteous	Given or giving freely. <i>The bounteous goodness of God.</i>
charitable	Relating to or characterized by charity. Charitable to the poor.
considerate	Careful not to inconvenience or harm others. <i>Friends considerate enough to leave us alone.</i>
dedication	A short message (as in a book or musical work or on a photograph) dedicating it to someone or something. <i>A faintly engraved inscription or dedication.</i>
devotion	Love, loyalty, or enthusiasm for a person or activity. <i>His devotion to duty never wavered.</i>
donor	An impurity atom in a semiconductor which contributes a conducting electron to the material. <i>A blood donor.</i>
eleemosynary	Generous in assistance to the poor. Eleemosynary relief.
generosity	Acting generously. <i>Diners certainly cannot complain about the generosity of portions.</i>
generous	Not petty in character and mind. <i>A generous assessment of his work.</i>
giver	A person who gives something. <i>A giver of advice.</i>
humane	(of a branch of learning) intended to have a civilizing effect on people. <i>The humane education of literary study.</i>
kind	A category of things distinguished by some common characteristic or quality. Kind to sick patients.
leniency	Mercifulness as a consequence of being lenient or tolerant. <i>The court could show leniency.</i>
love	Be enamored or in love with. <i>Children need a lot of love.</i>

magnanimous	Generous and understanding and tolerant. <i>She should be magnanimous in victory.</i>
mercy	Leniency and compassion shown toward offenders by a person or agency charged with administering justice. <i>He threw himself on the mercy of the court.</i>
mildness	Lack of severity. <i>The mildness of his manner and his desire to please everyone.</i>
munificent	Characterized by or displaying great generosity. <i>A munificent bequest.</i>
philanthropic	(of a person or organization) seeking to promote the welfare of others; generous and benevolent. <i>They receive financial support from philanthropic bodies.</i>
tolerant	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>These fish are quite tolerant as long as extremes of pH are avoided.</i>
undying	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>His undying fame.</i>
unselfish	Willing to put the needs or wishes of others before one's own. <i>Unselfish devotion.</i>
unstinting	Given or giving without restraint; unsparing. <i>Called for unstinting aid to Britain.</i>
wholehearted	Showing or characterized by complete sincerity and commitment. <i>Gave wholehearted support to her candidacy.</i>
