| purveyor | A person or group who spreads or promotes an idea, view, etc. A purveyor of traditional Christian values. |
| retailer | A person or business that sells goods to the public in relatively small quantities for use or consumption rather than for resale. As a writer I see myself as a retailer of Big Ideas. |
| shopkeeper | A merchant who owns or manages a shop. |
| stockist | One (as a retailer or distributor) that stocks goods. One of the country s largest stockist s of Italian designer labels. |
| <u>supplier</u> | Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. <i>The company has to pay</i> supplier s within 90 days of purchase. |
| trader | A merchant ship. |
| trafficker | A person who deals or trades in something illegal. The most notorious arms trafficker in the world. |
| vender | Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. |

| buyer | A person employed to select and purchase stock or materials for a large retail or manufacturing business. |
| clerk | Work as a clerk as in the legal business. Eleven of those who left college this year are clerk ing in auction stores. |
| fishmonger | Someone who sells fish. |
| huckster | A person who writes radio or tv advertisements. <i>He was huckstering a video.</i> |

| outsell | Be sold more often than other, similar products. The new Toyota outsell s the Honda by a wide margin. |
| peddle | Sell (an illegal drug or stolen item. <i>He peddled printing materials around the country.</i> |
| peddler | Someone who travels about selling his wares (as on the streets or at carnivals. A drug peddler . |
| price | Determine the price of. <i>He puts a high price on his services.</i> |
| purchaser | A person who buys something; a buyer. One of the club s prospective purchaser s. |
| <u>salesman</u> | A man salesperson. An insurance salesman . |
| salesperson | A salesman or saleswoman (used as a neutral alternative). |
| sell | Sell all of one s property possessions or assets. <i>The brothers sell shoes.</i> |
| selling | The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money. |
| shopkeeper | The owner and manager of a shop. |
| <u>store</u> | A depository for goods. A health food store . |
| subcontractor | A firm or person that carries out work for a company as part of a larger project. |
| trader | Someone who purchases and maintains an inventory of goods to be sold. |
| transferee | (law) someone to whom a title or property is conveyed. |
| undersell | Sell cheaper than one's competition. She feels she was undersell ing herself by putting her disability high on her CV. |
| vend | Sell or offer for sale from place to place. There was a man vend ing sticky cakes and ices. |
| <u>vendor</u> | A person or company offering something for sale, especially a trader in the street. An Italian ice cream vendor . |
| vintner | A wine merchant. |
| wholesale | At a wholesale price. The manufacturer s wholesale price. |
