### **Definitions of "Seller" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “seller” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money.*
- *A product that sells in some specified way.*
- *A person who sells something.*



## Synonyms of "Seller" as a noun (12 Words)

- dealer** The person who distributes the playing cards in a card game.  
*A brash young **dealer** arrived on the dealing floor.*
- marketer** Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money.  
*A leading manufacturer and **marketer** of medical products.*
- merchant** (in historical contexts) a person involved in trade or commerce.  
*A tea **merchant**.*
- purveyor** A person or group who spreads or promotes an idea, view, etc.  
*A **purveyor** of traditional Christian values.*
- retailer** A person or business that sells goods to the public in relatively small quantities for use or consumption rather than for resale.  
*As a writer I see myself as a **retailer** of Big Ideas.*
- shopkeeper** A merchant who owns or manages a shop.
- stockist** One (as a retailer or distributor) that stocks goods.  
*One of the country's largest **stockists** of Italian designer labels.*
- supplier** Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity.  
*The company has to pay **suppliers** within 90 days of purchase.*
- trader** A merchant ship.
- trafficker** A person who deals or trades in something illegal.  
*The most notorious arms **trafficker** in the world.*
- vender** Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money.

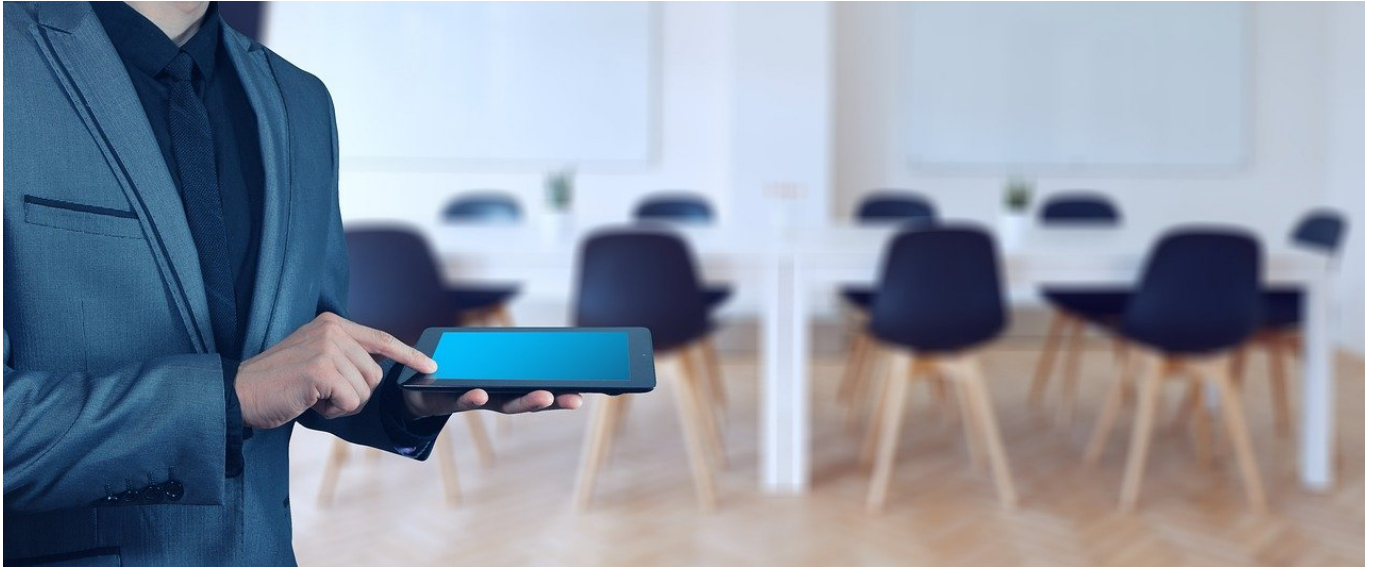
Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money.

**Usage Examples of "Seller" as a noun**

- *Street sellers of newspapers, flowers, etc.*

- *The book became the biggest seller in the history of royal publishing.*



## Associations of "Seller" (30 Words)

<b>auction</b>	Sell or offer for sale at an auction. <i>The books are expected to fetch a six figure sum at tomorrow s <b>auction</b>.</i>
<b>automat</b>	A cafeteria in which food and drink were obtained from slot machines.
<b>buy</b>	Be worth or be capable of buying. <i>Wine is rarely a good <b>buy</b> in duty free shops.</i>
<b>buyer</b>	A person employed to select and purchase stock or materials for a large retail or manufacturing business.
<b>clerk</b>	Work as a clerk as in the legal business. <i>Eleven of those who left college this year are <b>clerking</b> in auction stores.</i>
<b>fishmonger</b>	Someone who sells fish.
<b>huckster</b>	A person who writes radio or tv advertisements. <i>He was <b>huckstering</b> a video.</i>
<b>market</b>	The securities markets in the aggregate. <i>They wanted to browse around the street <b>market</b>.</i>
<b>marketer</b>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>A leading manufacturer and <b>marketer</b> of medical products.</i>
<b>marketplace</b>	An open space where a market is or was formerly held. <i>They were driven from the <b>marketplace</b>.</i>

<b>merchant</b>	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>Prosperous <b>merchants</b> and clothiers had established a middle class.</i>
<b>outsell</b>	Be sold more often than other, similar products. <i>The new Toyota <b>outsells</b> the Honda by a wide margin.</i>
<b>peddle</b>	Sell (an illegal drug or stolen item). <i>He <b>peddled</b> printing materials around the country.</i>
<b>peddler</b>	Someone who travels about selling his wares (as on the streets or at carnivals). <i>A drug <b>peddler</b>.</i>
<b>price</b>	Determine the price of. <i>He puts a high <b>price</b> on his services.</i>
<b>purchaser</b>	A person who buys something; a buyer. <i>One of the club s prospective <b>purchasers</b>.</i>
<b>salesman</b>	A man salesperson. <i>An insurance <b>salesman</b>.</i>
<b>salesperson</b>	A salesman or saleswoman (used as a neutral alternative).
<b>sell</b>	Sell all of one s property possessions or assets. <i>The brothers <b>sell</b> shoes.</i>
<b>selling</b>	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money.
<b>shopkeeper</b>	The owner and manager of a shop.
<b>store</b>	A depository for goods. <i>A health food <b>store</b>.</i>
<b>subcontractor</b>	A firm or person that carries out work for a company as part of a larger project.
<b>trader</b>	Someone who purchases and maintains an inventory of goods to be sold.
<b>transferee</b>	(law) someone to whom a title or property is conveyed.
<b>undersell</b>	Sell cheaper than one's competition. <i>She feels she was <b>underselling</b> herself by putting her disability high on her CV.</i>
<b>vend</b>	Sell or offer for sale from place to place. <i>There was a man <b>vending</b> sticky cakes and ices.</i>
<b>vendor</b>	A person or company offering something for sale, especially a trader in the street. <i>An Italian ice cream <b>vendor</b>.</i>
<b>vintner</b>	A wine merchant.
<b>wholesale</b>	At a wholesale price. <i>The manufacturer s <b>wholesale</b> price.</i>
