| <b><u>illustrate</u></b> | Serve as an example of.<br><i>The guide is <b>illustrated</b> with full colour photographs.</i>  |
| <b><u>imagery</u></b>    | Visually descriptive or figurative language, especially in a literary work.<br><i>Tennyson uses <b>imagery</b> to create a lyrical emotion.</i>  |
| <b>imitative</b>         | Copying or following a model or example.<br><i>Onomatopoeic words are <b>imitative</b> of noises.</i>  |
| <b>lifelike</b>          | Evoking lifelike images within the mind.<br><i>A <b>lifelike</b> pose.</i>   |
| <b><u>likelihood</u></b> | The probability of a specified outcome.<br><i>Situations where there is a <b>likelihood</b> of violence.</i>   |
| <b>meaning</b>           | The idea that is intended.<br><i>This can lead to new <b>meaning</b> in the life of older people.</i>  |
| <b>mimesis</b>           | The deliberate imitation of the behaviour of one group of people by another group as a factor in social change.<br><i>Culture is organized in terms of <b>mimesis</b> and desire.</i>                      |
| <b>mimetic</b>           | Exhibiting mimicry.<br><i>A <b>mimetic</b> dance.</i>  |
| <b>pictorial</b>         | Of or expressed in pictures; illustrated.<br><i>Feelings presented in a <b>pictorial</b> form.</i>   |
| <b>possibility</b>       | Unspecified qualities of a promising nature; potential.<br><i>There is a <b>possibility</b> that his sense of smell has been impaired.</i>   |

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| <b>probabilistic</b>  | Of or relating to the Roman Catholic philosophy of probabilism.<br><i>The main approaches are either rule based or <b>probabilistic</b>.</i>                                     |
| <b>randomize</b>      | Make (a set of items, people, etc.) unpredictable, unsystematic, or random in order or arrangement.<br><i>You can <b>randomize</b> the ingredients with the tap of a button.</i> |
| <b>realistic</b>      | Representing what is real; not abstract or ideal.<br><i><b>Realistic</b> portraiture.</i>  |
| <b>reasoning</b>      | Thinking that is coherent and logical.<br><i>He explained the <b>reasoning</b> behind his decision at a media conference.</i>  |
| <b>representation</b> | A performance of a play.<br><i>A Congressional vacancy occurred in the <b>representation</b> from California.</i>  |
| <b>schematic</b>      | In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit.<br><i><b>Schematic</b> diagrams.</i>   |
| <b>smoothed</b>       | Made smooth by ironing.  |
