deductive	Involving inferences from general principles. <i>I used my deductive powers.</i>
description	The action of giving a spoken or written account. <i>Every description of book was there.</i>
deterministic	An inevitable consequence of antecedent sufficient causes. <i>A deterministic theory.</i>
<u>drawing</u>	The art or activity of making drawings. <i>Drawings of abstract forms.</i>
fact	A thing that is known or proved to be true. <i>He supported his argument with an impressive array of facts.</i>
hieroglyph	Writing that resembles hieroglyphics usually by being illegible. <i>The International Organisation for Standardization is introducing two new hieroglyphs to perplex washing machine owners.</i>
ideogram	A character symbolizing the idea of a thing without indicating the sounds used to say it. Examples include numerals and Chinese characters. <i>Chinese characters are ideograms.</i>
<u>illustrate</u>	Serve as an example of. <i>The guide is illustrated with full colour photographs.</i>
<u>imagery</u>	Visually descriptive or figurative language, especially in a literary work. <i>Tennyson uses imagery to create a lyrical emotion.</i>
imitative	Copying or following a model or example. <i>Onomatopoeic words are imitative of noises.</i>
lifelike	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i>A lifelike pose.</i>
<u>likelihood</u>	The probability of a specified outcome. <i>Situations where there is a likelihood of violence.</i>
meaning	The idea that is intended. <i>This can lead to new meaning in the life of older people.</i>
mimesis	The deliberate imitation of the behaviour of one group of people by another group as a factor in social change. <i>Culture is organized in terms of mimesis and desire.</i>
mimetic	Exhibiting mimicry. <i>A mimetic dance.</i>
pictorial	Of or expressed in pictures; illustrated. <i>Feelings presented in a pictorial form.</i>
possibility	Unspecified qualities of a promising nature; potential. <i>There is a possibility that his sense of smell has been impaired.</i>

probabilistic	Of or relating to the Roman Catholic philosophy of probabilism. <i>The main approaches are either rule based or probabilistic.</i>
randomize	Make (a set of items, people, etc.) unpredictable, unsystematic, or random in order or arrangement. <i>You can randomize the ingredients with the tap of a button.</i>
<u>realistic</u>	Representing what is real; not abstract or ideal. <i>Realistic portraiture.</i>
<u>reasoning</u>	Thinking that is coherent and logical. <i>He explained the reasoning behind his decision at a media conference.</i>
representation	A performance of a play. <i>A Congressional vacancy occurred in the representation from California.</i>
<u>schematic</u>	In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit. <i>Schematic diagrams.</i>
smoothed	Made smooth by ironing.
<u>symbolic</u>	Using symbolism. <i>Symbolic thinking.</i>
technicolor	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
<u>vivid</u>	(of a colour) intensely deep or bright. <i>A bird with vivid plumage.</i>
