- *A class at university in which a topic is discussed by a teacher and a small group of students.*
- *Any meeting for an exchange of ideas.*

<b>awayday</b>	A day on which employees meet at a venue away from the workplace to plan strategy or to discuss a particular issue. <i>A worthwhile <b>awayday</b> on scenario planning.</i>
<b>class</b>	A division of candidates according to merit in a university examination. <i>The <b>class</b> system.</i>
<b>colloquy</b>	A conversation especially a formal one. <i>He found her in earnest <b>colloquy</b> with the postman.</i>
<b>conclave</b>	The meeting place for a conclave.
<b>conference</b>	A formal meeting for discussion. <i>An international <b>conference</b> on the environment.</i>
<b>congress</b>	The legislature of the United States government. <i>An international <b>congress</b> of mathematicians.</i>
<b>consultation</b>	A conference (usually with someone important). <i>They improved standards in <b>consultation</b> with consumer representatives.</i>

<b><u>convention</u></b>	Orthodoxy as a consequence of being conventional. <i>Political <b>convention</b>.</i>
<b>convocation</b>	A legislative or deliberative assembly of a university. <i>The arguments delayed the <b>convocation</b> of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>
<b>discussion</b>	An exchange of views on some topic. <i>See Appendix One for a more detailed <b>discussion</b>.</i>
<b>forum</b>	A meeting or medium where ideas and views on a particular issue can be exchanged. <i>We hope these pages act as a <b>forum</b> for debate.</i>
<b>lecture</b>	A long serious speech, especially one given as a scolding or reprimand. <i>The usual <b>lecture</b> on table manners.</i>
<b>lesson</b>	A thing learned or to be learned by a pupil. <i>An advanced <b>lesson</b> in maths.</i>
<b>meeting</b>	A small informal social gathering. <i>He intrigued her on their first <b>meeting</b>.</i>
<b>period</b>	The interval between successive equal values of a periodic function. <i><b>Period</b> pains.</i>
<b><u>session</u></b>	A period of recording music in a studio especially by a session musician. <i>He did the <b>sessions</b> for a Great Country Hits album.</i>
<b>study group</b>	A room used for reading and writing and studying.
<b><u>summit</u></b>	A meeting of heads of governments. <i>A <b>summit</b> meeting.</i>
<b><u>symposium</u></b>	A meeting or conference for the public discussion of some topic especially one in which the participants form an audience and make presentations.
<b>synod</b>	A Presbyterian ecclesiastical court above the presbyteries and subject to the General Assembly. <i>The deanery <b>synod</b>.</i>
<b>tutorial</b>	An account or explanation of a subject, printed or on a computer screen, intended for private study. <i>Formal teaching consists of lectures <b>tutorials</b> and practicals.</i>
<b>workshop</b>	A room or building in which goods are manufactured or repaired. <i>A writers <b>workshop</b> was held on 25 27 July.</i>

<b>congress</b>	A national legislative body, especially that of the US. The US Congress, which meets at the Capitol in Washington DC, was established by the Constitution of 1787 and is composed of the Senate and the House of Representatives. <i>Sexual <b>congress</b>.</i>
<b>consult</b>	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>Patients are entitled to be <b>consulted</b> about their treatment.</i>
<b>course</b>	The route or direction followed by a ship, aircraft, road, or river. <i>A business studies <b>course</b>.</i>
<b>diploma</b>	A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study.
<b>discipline</b>	Activity that provides mental or physical training. <i>He doesn't have to submit to normal <b>disciplines</b>.</i>
<b>education</b>	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>A course of <b>education</b>.</i>
<b>educational</b>	Providing knowledge. <i>An <b>educational</b> film.</i>
<b>educator</b>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional <b>educator</b>.</i>
<b>exercising</b>	The activity of exerting your muscles in various ways to keep fit. <i>He did some <b>exercising</b>.</i>
<b>forum</b>	A public facility to meet for open discussion. <i>We hope these pages act as a <b>forum</b> for debate.</i>
<b>homiletics</b>	The art of preaching.
<b>instruction</b>	(computer science) a line of code written as part of a computer program. <i>Always study the <b>instructions</b> supplied.</i>
<b>instructor</b>	A university teacher ranking below assistant professor. <i>A driving <b>instructor</b>.</i>
<b>lecture</b>	Deliver a lecture or talk. <i>In each course there are supporting <b>lectures</b> and tutorials.</i>
<b>lesson</b>	A period of learning or teaching. <i>An advanced <b>lesson</b> in maths.</i>

<b>mentor</b>	A wise and trusted guide and advisor. <i>Both trainees were expertly <b>mentored</b> by a site supervisor.</i>
<b>pedagogue</b>	Someone who educates young people.
<b>prentice</b>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>My brother was <b>prenticed</b> to a wheelwright.</i>
<b><u>session</u></b>	A period of recording music in a studio especially by a session musician. <i>It was one hell of a <b>session</b> we must have drunk about 12 cocktails each.</i>
<b>teaching</b>	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>Good classroom <b>teaching</b> is seldom rewarded.</i>
<b><u>trainee</u></b>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>
<b>training</b>	Activity leading to skilled behavior. <i>You ll have to go into strict <b>training</b>.</i>
<b>tutorial</b>	Relating to a tutor or a tutor's tuition. <i>A <b>tutorial</b> college.</i>
<b>workshop</b>	A room or building in which goods are manufactured or repaired. <i>The play was <b>workshopped</b> briefly at the Shaw Festival.</i>
