- (especially in journalism) the presentation of stories in a way that is intended to provoke public interest or excitement, at the expense of accuracy.
- The journalistic use of subject matter that appeals to vulgar tastes.
- Subject matter that is calculated to excite and please vulgar tastes.
- The ethical doctrine that feeling is the only criterion for what is good.

An event or competition involving the public display of animals,

show plants, or products.

That ceremony is just for **show**.

showiness Extravagant elaborateness.

splendour Magnificent features or qualities.

The **splendour**s of the imperial court.

An act of stirring food or drink.
