Associations of "Sensibilities" (30 Words)

affective	Denoting or relating to mental disorders in which disturbance of mood is the primary symptom. <i>Affective disorders.</i>
awareness	Concern about and well-informed interest in a particular situation or development. <i>There is a lack of awareness of the risks.</i>
bathetic	Effusively or insincerely emotional. <i>A bathetic novel.</i>
<u>cathartic</u>	Emotionally purging (of e.g. art). <i>Crying is a cathartic release.</i>
<u>cognition</u>	A perception sensation idea or intuition resulting from the process of cognition.

emotion	Instinctive or intuitive feeling as distinguished from reasoning or knowledge. <i>Responses have to be based on historical insight not simply on emotion.</i>
emotional	Arousing or characterized by intense feeling. <i>His behavior was highly emotional.</i>
empathy	The ability to understand and share the feelings of another.
feeling	An attitude or opinion. <i>A feeling of joy.</i>
maladjustment	Failure to cope with the demands of a normal social environment. <i>Economic maladjustment left the currency hopelessly vulnerable.</i>
maudlin	Effusively or insincerely emotional. <i>A maudlin jukebox tune.</i>
mawkish	Having a faint sickly flavour. <i>A mawkish ode to parenthood.</i>
melodrama	The genre of melodrama. <i>What little is known of his early life is cloaked in melodrama.</i>
<u>mental</u>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>Mental suffering.</i>
mind	Keep in mind. <i>He reads to improve his mind.</i>
mood	(especially of music) inducing or suggestive of a particular feeling or state of mind. <i>He was obviously in a mood.</i>
<u>moody</u>	Giving an impression of melancholy or mystery. <i>Grainy film which gives a soft moody effect.</i>
<u>pathos</u>	A quality that evokes pity or sadness. <i>The film captured all the pathos of their situation.</i>
prosody	Prosody a system of versification. <i>The translator is not obliged to reproduce the prosody of the original.</i>
<u>psychological</u>	Of, affecting, or arising in the mind; related to the mental and emotional state of a person. <i>Psychological research.</i>
psychologist	A scientist trained in psychology. <i>A sports psychologist.</i>
<u>psychology</u>	The mental factors governing a situation or activity. <i>The psychology of interpersonal relationships.</i>

sensitiveness	The ability to respond to affective changes in your interpersonal environment. <i>The sensitiveness of Mimosa leaves does not depend on a change of growth.</i>
<u>sentiment</u>	Tender, romantic, or nostalgic feeling or emotion. <i>I agree with your sentiments regarding the road bridge.</i>
<u>sentimental</u>	Given to or marked by sentiment or sentimentality. <i>A sentimental ballad.</i>
susceptibility	The ratio of magnetization produced in a material to the magnetizing force. <i>Lack of exercise increases susceptibility to disease.</i>
thought	Careful consideration or attention. <i>Darwinian thought.</i>
touched	Slightly mad; crazy. <i>Very touched by the stranger's kindness.</i>
<u>transference</u>	The redirection to a substitute usually a therapist of emotions that were originally felt in childhood in a phase of analysis called transference neurosis. <i>Therapy is aided by the patient's transference to the analyst as mother.</i>
unsentimental	Facing facts or difficulties realistically and with determination. <i>The speeches were short and unsentimental.</i>
