<b>sensational</b>	Very good indeed; very impressive or attractive. <i>You look <b>sensational</b>.</i>
<b>sensorial</b>	Involving or derived from the senses. <i><b>Sensorial</b> stimulation.</i>
<b>sumptuous</b>	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>The banquet was a <b>sumptuous</b> luxurious meal.</i>

<b>ambrosial</b>	Worthy of the gods. <i><b>Ambrosial</b> food.</i>
<b><u>aroma</u></b>	A subtle, pervasive quality or atmosphere. <i>The tantalizing <b>aroma</b> of fresh coffee.</i>
<b><u>aromatic</u></b>	An aromatic compound. <i>A massage with <b>aromatic</b> oils.</i>
<b>cerebrum</b>	The principal and most anterior part of the brain in vertebrates, located in the front area of the skull and consisting of two hemispheres, left and right, separated by a fissure. It is responsible for the integration of complex sensory and neural functions and the initiation and coordination of voluntary activity in the body.
<b><u>eureka</u></b>	An alloy of copper and nickel with high electrical resistance and a low temperature coefficient; used as resistance wire.
<b>feel</b>	Have a feeling or perception about oneself in reaction to someone's behavior or attitude. <i>The girls hated it when he tried to sneak a <b>feel</b>.</i>
<b><u>fragrance</u></b>	A distinctive odor that is pleasant. <i>Our fine selection of classic <b>fragrances</b> for men and women.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Pleasant-smelling. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<b>gustatory</b>	Concerned with tasting or the sense of taste. <i><b>Gustatory</b> delights.</i>
<b>musky</b>	Resembling the smell of musk.
<b><u>nerve</u></b>	Any bundle of nerve fibers running to various organs and tissues of the body. <i>He had the <b>nerve</b> to insult my cooking.</i>
<b>nerves</b>	Control of your emotions. <i>This kind of tension is not good for my <b>nerves</b>.</i>
<b><u>odor</u></b>	Any property detected by the olfactory system.
<b>odoriferous</b>	Having or giving off a smell, especially an unpleasant one. <i>An <b>odoriferous</b> pile of fish.</i>
<b>odorous</b>	Having a natural fragrance. <i>Fresh <b>odorous</b> bread.</i>
<b>olfaction</b>	The faculty that enables us to distinguish scents.
<b>olfactory</b>	Of or relating to olfaction. <i>The <b>olfactory</b> organs.</i>



<b><u>perceive</u></b>	Become aware or conscious of (something); come to realize or understand. <i>He <b>perceived</b> the faintest of flushes creeping up her neck.</i>
<b>perception</b>	Knowledge gained by perceiving. <i>Luther had a new <b>perception</b> of the Bible.</i>
<b>perceptual</b>	Of or relating to the act of perceiving. <i>A patient with <b>perceptual</b> problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<b><u>perfume</u></b>	Impregnate with perfume or a sweet smelling substance. <i>The cream is <b>perfumed</b> with rosemary and iris extracts.</i>
<b>recognize</b>	Show official appreciation of; reward formally. <i>These qualifications are <b>recognized</b> by the Department of Education.</i>
<b><u>scent</u></b>	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>A glass of tea <b>scented</b> with a local herb.</i>
<b>sensate</b>	Perceiving or perceived by the senses. <i><b>Sensate</b> creatures.</i>
<b>sense</b>	Become aware of not through the senses but instinctively. <i>A good <b>sense</b> of timing.</i>
<b>smell</b>	Smell bad. <i>I <b>smell</b> trouble.</i>
<b>synapse</b>	The junction between two neurons (axon-to-dendrite) or between a neuron and a muscle. <i>Nerve impulses cross a <b>synapse</b> through the action of neurotransmitters.</i>
<b>taste</b>	The sensation that results when taste buds in the tongue and throat convey information about the chemical composition of a soluble stimulus. <i>This pudding is too sweet for my <b>taste</b>.</i>
<b><u>visceral</u></b>	Obtained through intuition rather than from reasoning or observation. <i>The voters <b>visceral</b> fear of change.</i>
<b><u>visual</u></b>	Visible. <i><b>Visual</b> navigation.</i>
