- lush** Characterized by extravagance and profusion.  
*These architecture magazines are full of the **lush** interiors of the rich and famous.*
- luxurious** Extremely comfortable or elegant, especially when involving great expense.  
*A **luxurious** wallow in a scented bath.*

**pleasurable**

Pleasing; enjoyable.

*Good printing makes a book more **pleasurable** to read.*

**rich**

Marked by richness and fullness of flavor.

*A **rich** supply.*

**seductive**

Tempting and attractive; enticing.

*A **seductive** voice.*

**sexually attractive** Having power to arouse interest.

**sumptuous**

Splendid and expensive-looking.

*The banquet was a **sumptuous** luxurious meal.*

**voluptuous**

Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses.

*Long curtains in **voluptuous** crimson velvet.*



## Usage Examples of "Sensuous" as an adjective

- *Her voice was rather deep but very sensuous.*
- *The sensuous joy from all things fair.*
- *The work showed a deliberate disregard of the more sensuous and immediately appealing aspects of painting.*

*My lack of **artistic** ability.*

<b>attractive</b>	Having power to arouse interest. <i>A remarkably <b>attractive</b> young man.</i>
<b><u>buxom</u></b>	Having a large bosom and pleasing curves. <i>A <b>buxom</b> blonde.</i>
<b><u>copious</u></b>	Abundant in supply or quantity. <i>She took <b>copious</b> notes.</i>
<b>cosmetic</b>	Relating to treatment intended to restore or improve a person's appearance. <i><b>Cosmetic</b> creams.</i>
<b>cuisine</b>	Food cooked in a certain way. <i>Much Venetian <b>cuisine</b> is based on seafood.</i>
<b>epicure</b>	A person who takes particular pleasure in fine food and drink. <i>They see themselves as <b>epicures</b> delighting in food that is properly prepared.</i>
<b>epicurean</b>	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i><b>Epicurean</b> pleasures.</i>
<b>esthetic</b>	Aesthetically pleasing. <i>The <b>aesthetic</b> faculties.</i>
<b>feeling</b>	An emotional state or reaction. <i>He laughed to conceal his true <b>feelings</b>.</i>
<b><u>flavor</u></b>	Lend flavor to.
<b>gastronome</b>	A gourmet. <i><b>Gastronomes</b> will be fascinated by this guide to French cooking.</i>
<b>gourmet</b>	Of a kind or standard suitable for a gourmet. <i>A <b>gourmet</b> meal.</i>
<b>gustatory</b>	Concerned with tasting or the sense of taste. <i><b>Gustatory</b> delights.</i>
<b><u>palatable</u></b>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>A very <b>palatable</b> local red wine.</i>
<b>piquancy</b>	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian <b>piquancy</b>.</i>
<b>preference</b>	A thing preferred. <i>Her <b>preference</b> for white wine.</i>
<b><u>satisfactory</u></b>	Meeting requirements. <i>He didn't get a <b>satisfactory</b> answer.</i>
<b><u>savor</u></b>	Give taste to. <i><b>Savor</b> the soup.</i>
<b><u>savory</u></b>	Either of two aromatic herbs of the mint family. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>

<b>savour</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle <b>savour</b> of wood smoke.</i>
<b>sensual</b>	Sexually exciting or gratifying. <i>A <b>sensual</b> delight in eating.</i>
<b><u>stacked</u></b>	(of a number of things) put or arranged in a stack or stacks. <i>MIDI interface featuring <b>stacked</b> MIDI note numbers.</i>
<b>tang</b>	The imperial dynasty of China from 618 to 907. <i>The clean salty <b>tang</b> of the sea.</i>
<b>taste</b>	A kind of sensing distinguishing substances by means of the taste buds. <i>He got a <b>taste</b> of life on the wild side.</i>
<b><u>tasteful</u></b>	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. <i>A <b>tasteful</b> lounge bar.</i>
<b><u>voluptuous</u></b>	Relating to or characterized by luxury or sensual pleasure. <i>Lucullus spent the remainder of his days in <b>voluptuous</b> magnificence.</i>
<b>zesty</b>	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
