- *Relating to or affecting the senses rather than the intellect.*

aesthetic	Aesthetically pleasing. <i>Aesthetic feeling.</i>
gratifying	Giving pleasure or satisfaction. <i>Found her praise gratifying.</i>
<u>luscious</u>	(of food or drink) having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste. <i>The luscious brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
<u>lush</u>	Characterized by extravagance and profusion. <i>These architecture magazines are full of the lush interiors of the rich and famous.</i>
<u>luxurious</u>	Extremely comfortable or elegant, especially when involving great expense. <i>A luxurious wallow in a scented bath.</i>

pleasurable

Pleasing; enjoyable.

*Good printing makes a book more **pleasurable** to read.*

rich

Marked by richness and fullness of flavor.

*A **rich** supply.*

seductive

Tempting and attractive; enticing.

*A **seductive** voice.*

sexually attractive Having power to arouse interest.

sumptuous

Splendid and expensive-looking.

*The banquet was a **sumptuous** luxurious meal.*

voluptuous

Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses.

*Long curtains in **voluptuous** crimson velvet.*



Usage Examples of "Sensuous" as an adjective

- *Her voice was rather deep but very sensuous.*
- *The sensuous joy from all things fair.*
- *The work showed a deliberate disregard of the more sensuous and immediately appealing aspects of painting.*

attractive	Having power to arouse interest. <i>A remarkably attractive young man.</i>
buxom	Having a large bosom and pleasing curves. <i>A buxom blonde.</i>
copious	Abundant in supply or quantity. <i>She took copious notes.</i>
cosmetic	Relating to treatment intended to restore or improve a person's appearance. <i>Cosmetic creams.</i>
cuisine	Food cooked in a certain way. <i>Much Venetian cuisine is based on seafood.</i>
epicure	A person who takes particular pleasure in fine food and drink. <i>They see themselves as epicures delighting in food that is properly prepared.</i>
epicurean	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i>Epicurean pleasures.</i>
esthetic	Aesthetically pleasing. <i>The aesthetic faculties.</i>
feeling	An emotional state or reaction. <i>He laughed to conceal his true feelings.</i>
flavor	Lend flavor to.
gastronome	A gourmet. <i>Gastronomes will be fascinated by this guide to French cooking.</i>
gourmet	Of a kind or standard suitable for a gourmet. <i>A gourmet meal.</i>
gustatory	Concerned with tasting or the sense of taste. <i>Gustatory delights.</i>
palatable	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>A very palatable local red wine.</i>
piquancy	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian piquancy.</i>
preference	A thing preferred. <i>Her preference for white wine.</i>
satisfactory	Meeting requirements. <i>He didn't get a satisfactory answer.</i>
savor	Give taste to. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savory	Either of two aromatic herbs of the mint family. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>

savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle savour of wood smoke.</i>
sensual	Sexually exciting or gratifying. <i>A sensual delight in eating.</i>
<u>stacked</u>	(of a number of things) put or arranged in a stack or stacks. <i>MIDI interface featuring stacked MIDI note numbers.</i>
tang	The imperial dynasty of China from 618 to 907. <i>The clean salty tang of the sea.</i>
taste	A kind of sensing distinguishing substances by means of the taste buds. <i>He got a taste of life on the wild side.</i>
<u>tasteful</u>	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. <i>A tasteful lounge bar.</i>
<u>voluptuous</u>	Relating to or characterized by luxury or sensual pleasure. <i>Lucullus spent the remainder of his days in voluptuous magnificence.</i>
zesty	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
