gratifying	Giving pleasure or satisfaction. Found her praise <b>gratifying</b> .
<u>luscious</u>	(of food or drink) having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste. The <b>luscious</b> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.
<u>lush</u>	Characterized by extravagance and profusion. These architecture magazines are full of the <b>lush</b> interiors of the rich and famous.
<u>luxurious</u>	Extremely comfortable or elegant, especially when involving great expense. A <b>luxurious</b> wallow in a scented bath.



<u>pleasurable</u>	Pleasing; enjoyable. Good printing makes a book more <b>pleasurable</b> to read.
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. A <b>rich</b> supply.
seductive	Tempting and attractive; enticing. A <b>seductive</b> voice.
sexually attractive Having power to arouse interest.	
<u>sumptuous</u>	Splendid and expensive-looking. The banquet was a <b>sumptuous</b> luxurious meal.
<u>voluptuous</u>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. Long curtains in <b>voluptuous</b> crimson velvet.

appetizing	Appealing to or stimulating the appetite especially in appearance or aroma. <i>The appetizing aroma of sizzling bacon.</i>
<u>artistic</u>	Aesthetically pleasing. My lack of <b>artistic</b> ability.



attractive	Having power to arouse interest. A remarkably <b>attractive</b> young man.
<u>buxom</u>	Having a large bosom and pleasing curves. A <b>buxom</b> blonde.
<u>copious</u>	Abundant in supply or quantity. She took <b>copious</b> notes.
cosmetic	Relating to treatment intended to restore or improve a person's appearance. <i>Cosmetic creams.</i>
cuisine	Food cooked in a certain way. Much Venetian <b>cuisine</b> is based on seafood.
epicure	A person who takes particular pleasure in fine food and drink. They see themselves as <b>epicure</b> s delighting in food that is properly prepared.
epicurean	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i>Epicurean</i> pleasures.
esthetic	Aesthetically pleasing. <i>The a<b>esthetic</b> faculties.</i>
feeling	An emotional state or reaction. <i>He laughed to conceal his true <b>feeling</b>s.</i>
<u>flavor</u>	Lend flavor to.
gastronome	A gourmet. <i>Gastronomes will be fascinated by this guide to French cooking.</i>
gourmet	Of a kind or standard suitable for a gourmet. A <b>gourmet</b> meal.
gustatory	Concerned with tasting or the sense of taste. <i>Gustatory</i> delights.
<u>palatable</u>	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. A very <b>palatable</b> local red wine.
piquancy	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. The tangy soy dip gave them a slightly Asian <b>piquancy</b> .
preference	A thing preferred. <i>Her <b>preference</b> for white wine.</i>
<u>satisfactory</u>	Meeting requirements. He didn t get a <b>satisfactory</b> answer.
<u>savor</u>	Give taste to. <i>Savor</i> the soup.
<u>savory</u>	Either of two aromatic herbs of the mint family. A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b> .



savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle savour of wood smoke.</i>
sensual	Sexually exciting or gratifying. A <b>sensual</b> delight in eating.
<u>stacked</u>	(of a number of things) put or arranged in a stack or stacks. MIDI interface featuring <b>stacked</b> MIDI note numbers.
tang	The imperial dynasty of China from 618 to 907. The clean salty <b>tang</b> of the sea.
taste	A kind of sensing distinguishing substances by means of the taste buds. <i>He got a <b>taste</b> of life on the wild side.</i>
<u>tasteful</u>	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. A <b>tasteful</b> lounge bar.
<u>voluptuous</u>	Relating to or characterized by luxury or sensual pleasure. Lucullus spent the remainder of his days in <b>voluptuous</b> magnificence.
zesty	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
