capable of feeling	Having the temperament or inclination for.
feeling	Showing emotion or sensitivity. She was a <b>feeling</b> child.
live	Abounding with life and energy. A <b>live</b> ball is one in play.
living	Pertaining to living persons. The <b>living</b> quarters of the pub.

acknowledge	Report the receipt of. <i>The program committee</i> <b>acknowledge</b> <i>d</i> the submission of the authors of the paper.	
advised	Having received information. A well <b>advised</b> delay in carrying out the plan.	
<u>animate</u>	Belonging to the class of nouns that denote living beings. Prometheus stole fire from heaven to <b>animate</b> his clay men.	
apprehensible	Capable of being apprehended or understood. A bat whirred <b>apprehensible</b> only from the displacement of air.	
<u>awake</u>	Make or become active again. Too few are <b>awake</b> to the dangers.	
awaken	Make someone aware of (something) for the first time. <i>He sighed but did not <b>awaken</b>.</i>	
aware	Having knowledge or perception of a situation or fact. <i>Aware</i> that he had exceeded the speed limit.	
awareness	Having knowledge of. His political <b>awareness</b> developed.	
cognitive	Of or being or relating to or involving cognition. The <b>cognitive</b> processes involved in reading.	
cognizance	Having knowledge of. The Renaissance <b>cognizance</b> of Greece was limited.	
cognizant	(sometimes followed by `of') having or showing knowledge or understanding or realization or perception. <i>Statesmen must be</i> <b>cognizant</b> of the political boundaries within which they work.	
conscious	Intentionally conceived. We are <b>conscious</b> of the extent of the problem.	



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waken	Stop sleeping. <i>She knew he would <b>waken</b> in an hour or so.</i>
waking	The state of remaining awake. He hangs between sleeping and <b>waking</b> .
