- *Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil.*
- *Completely clear and fine.*



## Synonyms of "Serene" as an adjective (26 Words)

### calm

(of a place) peaceful after violent activity.

*The city was reported to be **calm** but army patrols remained.*

### collected

(of a horse) moving with a shortened stride and with its hind legs correctly placed to achieve balance and impulsion.

*The **collected** works of Shakespeare.*

<b>composed</b>	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>I felt calm and more <b>composed</b> than I had in a long time.</i>
<b>cool, calm, and collected</b>	Fashionable and attractive at the time; often skilled or socially adept.
<b>equable</b>	Not varying or fluctuating greatly. <i>An <b>equable</b> temper.</i>
<b>even-tempered</b>	Not easily irritated.
<b><u>imperturbable</u></b>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>An <b>imperturbable</b> self possession.</i>
<b>pacific</b>	Disposed to peace or of a peaceful nature. <i>The result of this <b>pacific</b> policy was that no troops were called up.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>She said her dad was a <b>peaceful</b> man who was always happy.</i>
<b><u>placid</u></b>	Not easily irritated. <i>A ribbon of sand between the angry sea and the <b>placid</b> bay.</i>
<b><u>poised</u></b>	In full control of your faculties. <i>A gull in <b>poised</b> flight.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	Characterized by an absence or near absence of agitation or activity. <i>His <b>quiet</b> middle aged parents.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	(of a muscle or other body part) not tense. <i>Gave the impression of being quite <b>relaxed</b>.</i>
<b>relaxing</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The warm water was very <b>relaxing</b>.</i>
<b><u>restful</u></b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and <b>restful</b>.</i>
<b>self-possessed</b>	In full control of your faculties.
<b><u>soothing</u></b>	Reducing pain or discomfort. <i>Almond oil is renowned for its <b>soothing</b> properties.</i>
<b>still</b>	Not sparkling. <i>The night was <b>still</b>.</i>
<b><u>tranquil</u></b>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i><b>Tranquil</b> life in the country.</i>
<b>unagitated</b>	Not agitated or disturbed emotionally.



**undisturbed**

Untroubled by interference or disturbance.  
*A quiet weekend of **undisturbed** tranquillity.*

**unexcitable**

Not easily excited.  
*An **unexcitable** temperament.*

**unperturbed**

Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension.  
*Kenneth seems **unperturbed** by the news.*

**unruffled**

Free from emotional agitation or nervous tension- Anthony Trollope.  
*Robbie seemed **unruffled** by her words.*

**untroubled**

Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress.  
***Untroubled** times.*

**unworried**

Free of trouble and worry and care.  
*Foreign investors are largely **unworried** by the government's fall.*



## Usage Examples of "Serene" as an adjective

- *He remained serene in the midst of turbulence.*
- *Serene skies and a bright blue sea.*
- *A serene expression on her face.*
- *Her eyes were closed and she looked very serene.*
- *Serene certainty.*

<b><a href="#">ambience</a></b>	The character and atmosphere of a place. <i>The relaxed <b>ambience</b> of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.</i>
<b>calm</b>	The absence of strong emotions calm feelings. <i>The night was clear and <b>calm</b>.</i>
<b>calming</b>	The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of).
<b>composed</b>	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>A very talented and <b>composed</b> young player.</i>
<b>coolheaded</b>	Marked by calm self-control (especially in trying circumstances); unemotional. <i>Stayed <b>coolheaded</b> in the crisis.</i>
<b>halcyon</b>	Idyllically calm and peaceful; suggesting happy tranquillity. <i>The <b>halcyon</b> days of the mid 1980s when profits were soaring.</i>



<b><u>idyllic</u></b>	Like an idyll; extremely happy, peaceful, or picturesque. <i>An <b>idyllic</b> spot for a picnic.</i>
<b><u>imperturbable</u></b>	Unable to be upset or excited; calm. <i>Hitherto <b>imperturbable</b> he now showed signs of alarm.</i>
<b>noiseless</b>	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>The cycle is a <b>noiseless</b> form of transport.</i>
<b>nonviolence</b>	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
<b>nonviolent</b>	Achieved without bloodshed.
<b>pacific</b>	The largest ocean in the world. <i>The <b>pacific</b> temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.</i>
<b><u>pacifist</u></b>	A person who believes that war and violence are unjustifiable. <i>She was a committed <b>pacifist</b> all her life.</i>
<b>peaceable</b>	Inclined to avoid conflict or dissent. <i>In a <b>peaceable</b> and orderly manner.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>She said her dad was a <b>peaceful</b> man who was always happy.</i>
<b>peacetime</b>	A period when a country is not at war. <i>In <b>peacetime</b> regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.</i>
<b>pigeon</b>	A pigeon descended from the wild rock dove kept for racing showing and carrying messages and common as a feral bird in towns.
<b><u>placid</u></b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>Remained <b>placid</b> despite the repeated delays.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Causing no symptoms. <i>The <b>quiescent</b> melancholy of the town.</i>
<b>quietude</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>A moment of <b>quietude</b>.</i>
<b>relaxing</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The warm water was very <b>relaxing</b>.</i>
<b><u>restful</u></b>	Having a quiet and soothing quality. <i>She spent a <b>restful</b> night at home.</i>
<b><u>rustic</u></b>	A small brownish European moth. <i><b>Rustic</b> awkwardness.</i>
<b><u>stillness</u></b>	(poetic) tranquil silence. <i>An eerie <b>stillness</b> engulfed the camp.</i>
<b><u>tranquil</u></b>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The sea was <b>tranquil</b>.</i>

- tranquility** An untroubled state; free from disturbances.
- tranquelize** Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
- tranquillity** A state of peace and quiet.  
*Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the **tranquillity** of rural life.*
- unarmed** (used of persons or the military) not having or using arms.  
*He was shooting **unarmed** civilians.*
- unflappable** Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure.  
***Unflappable** in a crisis.*
