## Associations of "Set square" (30 Words)

<a href="#">array</a>	An orderly arrangement. <i>His tools were in an orderly <b>array</b> on the basement wall.</i>
<b>cube</b>	A block in the approximate shape of a cube. <i><b>Cube</b> the cheese.</i>
<b>cubic</b>	A cubic equation or a curve described by one. <i>A <b>cubic</b> equation.</i>
<b>decagon</b>	A polygon with 10 sides and 10 angles.
<b>dice</b>	Play or gamble with dice. <i>Cut the meat into <b>dice</b>.</i>
<a href="#">facet</a>	A distinct feature or element in a problem. <i>He studied every <b>facet</b> of the question.</i>
<b>grid</b>	A field for American football a gridiron. <i>A <b>grid</b> of tree lined streets.</i>
<b>hexagon</b>	A plane figure with six straight sides and angles.
<b>hexagonal</b>	Of or denoting a crystal system or three-dimensional geometrical arrangement having three axes of equal length separated by 60° and a fourth axis of a different length at right angles to these. <i>Small <b>hexagonal</b> pockets of honeycomb.</i>
<b>lattice</b>	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lift stopped and he peered through the metal <b>lattice</b>.</i>
<b>matching</b>	Equal in number or amount; equivalent. <i>The college will provide <b>matching</b> funds to complete the project.</i>
<a href="#">multifaceted</a>	Having many different aspects or features. <i>The diamond s <b>multifaceted</b> surface.</i>
<b>nonagon</b>	A plane figure with nine straight sides and nine angles.
<b>octagon</b>	An object or building with an octagonal plan or cross section.

<b>oval</b>	A body object or design with an oval shape or outline. <i>Cut out two small <b>ovals</b> from the felt.</i>
<b>pentagon</b>	A five-sided polygon.
<b>pentagram</b>	A star with 5 points; formed by 5 straight lines between the vertices of a pentagon and enclosing another pentagon.
<b>place</b>	Score a goal by a place kick. <i>They hurried to their <b>places</b> at the table.</i>
<b>polygon</b>	A plane figure with at least three straight sides and angles, and typically five or more.
<b>quadrate</b>	Roughly square or rectangular. <i>The materials are there <b>quadrated</b> or formed into rectangular blocks.</i>
<b>quadrilateral</b>	Having four straight sides.
<b>rectangle</b>	A plane figure with four straight sides and four right angles, especially one with unequal adjacent sides, in contrast to a square.
<b>rectangular</b>	Having four right angles. <i>A neat <b>rectangular</b> area.</i>
<b>rectilinear</b>	(of a wide-angle lens) corrected as much as possible, so that straight lines in the subject appear straight in the image. <i>The <b>rectilinear</b> propagation of light.</i>
<b>shape</b>	Give a particular shape or form to. <i>Houseplants come in all <b>shapes</b> and sizes.</i>
<b>tetragon</b>	A four-sided polygon.
<b>trapezoid</b>	A small carpal bone in the base of the hand, articulating with the metacarpal of the index finger.
<b>triangle</b>	A percussion instrument consisting of a metal bar bent in the shape of an open triangle. <i>An equilateral <b>triangle</b>.</i>
<b>triangulate</b>	Divide (an area) into triangles for surveying purposes. <i><b>Triangulate</b> the piece of cardboard.</i>
<b>vertex</b>	The crown of the head.
