abyss	A bottomless gulf or pit; any unfathomable (or apparently unfathomable) cavity or chasm or void extending below (often used figuratively). <i>A rope led down into the dark abyss.</i>
below	See below. <i>Our nutritionist is pictured below right.</i>
beneath	In or to a place that is lower. <i>A house built on stilts to allow air to circulate beneath.</i>
bottom	Provide with a bottom or a seat. <i>They came bottom with 17 points.</i>
crypt	A cellar or vault or underground burial chamber (especially beneath a church).
declension	The inflection of nouns and pronouns and adjectives in Indo-European languages. <i>The declension of the new generation.</i>
declivity	A downward slope. <i>A thickly wooded declivity.</i>
descend	Move down a scale of quality. <i>His lands descended to his eldest son.</i>
descending	Moving down a scale of quality. <i>A rocky descending path.</i>
descent	Properties attributable to your ancestry. <i>A descent on the Channel ports.</i>
disparagement	A communication that belittles somebody or something.
downstairs	Situated downstairs. <i>The downstairs or downstair phone.</i>

downward	Used to indicate that something applies to everyone in a certain hierarchy or set. <i>The downward pull of gravity.</i>
drop	An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute. <i>Tourism has dropped off in the last few years.</i>
falling	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity. <i>She was injured by a falling tree.</i>
grantee	A recipient of a grant.
located	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Valuable centrally located urban land.</i>
low	An air mass of lower pressure often brings precipitation. <i>Low ceilings.</i>
lower	Make lower or quieter. <i>Flora stuck out her lower lip.</i>
nether	Located below or beneath something else. <i>Gnawed his nether lip.</i>
parachute	Jump from an airplane and descend with a parachute. <i>An air operation to parachute relief supplies into the region.</i>
sink	Cause a ship to sink. <i>The ocean is a sink for carbon dioxide.</i>
sit	A period of sitting. <i>I cannot baby sit tonight I have too much homework to do.</i>
snuggle	Move or arrange oneself in a comfortable and cozy position. <i>She snuggled her head into his shoulder.</i>
submergence	The process or state of being submerged in or covered with water. <i>Politicians may be blamed for submergence of principle.</i>
subnormal	(of a person) having learning difficulties or a developmental disorder. <i>Subnormal intelligence.</i>
under	Under water. <i>The under parts of a machine.</i>
underneath	Under or below an object or a surface; at a lower place or level; directly beneath. <i>Paint was peeling off in flakes to reveal greyish plaster underneath.</i>
underpass	An underground tunnel or passage enabling pedestrians to cross a road or railway.

vertically

At right angles to a horizontal plane; aligned in such a way that the top is directly above the bottom.
