<b>agitated</b>	Feeling or appearing troubled or nervous. <i><b>Agitated</b> parents.</i>
<b>bias</b>	Give a bias to. <i>Readers said the paper was <b>biased</b> towards the Conservatives.</i>
<b>biased</b>	Favoring one person or side over another. <i>A <b>biased</b> account of the trial.</i>
<b>bigot</b>	A prejudiced person who is intolerant of any opinions differing from his own. <i>Don't let a few small minded <b>bigots</b> destroy the good image of the city.</i>
<b>bigoted</b>	Obstinately or unreasonably attached to a belief, opinion, or faction, in particular prejudiced against or antagonistic towards a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular group. <i>A thoughtless and <b>bigoted</b> article.</i>
<b>bigotry</b>	The intolerance and prejudice of a bigot. <i>The difficulties of combating prejudice and <b>bigotry</b>.</i>
<b>discriminate</b>	Perceive or constitute the difference in or between. <i>Features that <b>discriminate</b> this species from other gastropods.</i>
<b>discrimination</b>	The cognitive process whereby two or more stimuli are distinguished. <i><b>Discrimination</b> between right and wrong.</i>
<b>discriminatory</b>	Manifesting partiality. <i>A <b>discriminatory</b> tax.</i>
<b>equality</b>	The state of being equal, especially in status, rights, or opportunities. <i>An organization aiming to promote racial <b>equality</b>.</i>
<b>fanaticism</b>	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>The dangers of religious <b>fanaticism</b>.</i>
<b>feminist</b>	Of or relating to or advocating equal rights for women. <i><b>Feminist</b> literature.</i>
<b>illiberal</b>	Uncultured or unrefined. <i><b>Illiberal</b> and anti democratic policies.</i>
<b>impatient</b>	Having or showing a tendency to be quickly irritated or provoked. <i>He was <b>impatient</b> to be on his way.</i>
<b>injustice</b>	Lack of fairness or justice. <i>Brooding over life's <b>injustices</b>.</i>
<b>intolerance</b>	Impatience with annoyances. <i>An <b>intolerance</b> of dissent.</i>

<b><u>intolerant</u></b>	(of a plant or animal) unable to survive exposure to (a particular physical influence). <i>As a society we are more <b>intolerant</b> of certain types of violence than we were in the past.</i>
<b>invidious</b>	Containing or implying a slight or showing prejudice. <i>She d put herself in an <b>invidious</b> position.</i>
<b>jaundiced</b>	Affected by bitterness, resentment, or cynicism. <i>Looked with a <b>jaundiced</b> eye on the growth of regimentation.</i>
<b>misogynist</b>	Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A bachelor and renowned <b>misogynist</b>.</i>
<b>ostracism</b>	The state of being banished or ostracized (excluded from society by general consent). <i>The <b>ostracism</b> of Thucydides.</i>
<b><u>partial</u></b>	Existing only in part; incomplete. <i>Strings would like to oscillate as closely as possible to harmonic <b>partials</b>.</i>
<b>prejudice</b>	Disadvantage by prejudice. <i><b>Prejudice</b> against people from different backgrounds.</i>
<b>prejudiced</b>	Emanating from a person's emotions and prejudices. <i><b>Prejudiced</b> views.</i>
<b>racism</b>	The prejudice that members of one race are intrinsically superior to members of other races. <i>A programme to combat <b>racism</b>.</i>
<b>racist</b>	A person who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. <i>We are investigating complaints about <b>racist</b> abuse.</i>
<b>sexism</b>	Prejudice, stereotyping, or discrimination, typically against women, on the basis of sex. <i><b>Sexism</b> in language is an offensive reminder of the way the culture sees women.</i>
<b><u>unfavorable</u></b>	Involving or creating circumstances detrimental to success or effectiveness. <i><b>Unfavorable</b> winds.</i>
<b>xenophobia</b>	Dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries. <i>The resurgence of racism and <b>xenophobia</b>.</i>
