| discriminate | Perceive or constitute the difference in or between. <i>Features that discriminate this species from other gastropods.</i> |
| discrimination | The cognitive process whereby two or more stimuli are distinguished. <i>Discrimination between right and wrong.</i> |
| discriminatory | Manifesting partiality. <i>A discriminatory tax.</i> |
| equality | The state of being equal, especially in status, rights, or opportunities. <i>An organization aiming to promote racial equality.</i> |
| fanaticism | Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>The dangers of religious fanaticism.</i> |
| feminist | Of or relating to or advocating equal rights for women. <i>Feminist literature.</i> |
| illiberal | Uncultured or unrefined. <i>Illiberal and anti democratic policies.</i> |
| impatient | Having or showing a tendency to be quickly irritated or provoked. <i>He was impatient to be on his way.</i> |
| injustice | Lack of fairness or justice. <i>Brooding over life's injustices.</i> |
| intolerance | Impatience with annoyances. <i>An intolerance of dissent.</i> |

| intolerant | (of a plant or animal) unable to survive exposure to (a particular physical influence). <i>As a society we are more intolerant of certain types of violence than we were in the past.</i> |

| jaundiced | Affected by bitterness, resentment, or cynicism. <i>Looked with a jaundiced eye on the growth of regimentation.</i> |
| misogynist | Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A bachelor and renowned misogynist.</i> |
| ostracism | The state of being banished or ostracized (excluded from society by general consent). <i>The ostracism of Thucydides.</i> |
| partial | Existing only in part; incomplete. <i>Strings would like to oscillate as closely as possible to harmonic partials.</i> |
| prejudice | Disadvantage by prejudice. <i>Prejudice against people from different backgrounds.</i> |
| prejudiced | Emanating from a person's emotions and prejudices. <i>Prejudiced views.</i> |
| racism | The prejudice that members of one race are intrinsically superior to members of other races. <i>A programme to combat racism.</i> |
| racist | A person who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. <i>We are investigating complaints about racist abuse.</i> |
| sexism | Prejudice, stereotyping, or discrimination, typically against women, on the basis of sex. <i>Sexism in language is an offensive reminder of the way the culture sees women.</i> |
| unfavorable | Involving or creating circumstances detrimental to success or effectiveness. <i>Unfavorable winds.</i> |
| xenophobia | Dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries. <i>The resurgence of racism and xenophobia.</i> |
