

### Synonyms of "Shattered" as an adjective (17 Words)

asleep on one's feet Lacking sensation.

debilitated	In a very weakened and infirm state. I became very <b>debilitated</b> with tremendous joint pain.
distressed	Suffering severe physical strain or distress. <i>He dropped out of the race clearly</i> <b>distressed</b> <i>and having difficulty breathing.</i>
dog-tired	Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted.
<u>drained</u>	Drained of electric charge discharged. A <b>drained</b> marsh.
enervated	Lacking energy or vitality. Daniel felt too <b>enervated</b> to resist.
exhausted	Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted. <i>Exhausted</i> peat workings.
fatigued	Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted.



fraught	(of a situation or course of action) filled with or likely to result in (something undesirable. <i>Words <b>fraught</b> with meaning.</i>
on one's last legs	Conclusive in a process or progression.
ready to drop	Immediately available.
spent	Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted. <i>The movement has become a <b>spent</b> force.</i>
<u>tattered</u>	Ruined or disrupted. A man in a <b>tattered</b> shirt.
tired out	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.
upset	Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief. The Bills <b>upset</b> victory over the Houston Oilers.
<u>weary</u>	Calling for a great amount of energy or endurance; tiring and tedious. <i>War <b>weary</b> Americans.</i>
worried	Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc. Michelle knew that her friends were very <b>worried</b> about her.





#### Usage Examples of "Shattered" as an adjective

- *He was said to be absolutely shattered after losing his job.*
- I usually feel too shattered to do more than crawl into bed.
- Our shattered dreams of peace and prosperity.

<u>afraid</u>	Worried that something undesirable will occur or be done. <i>Afraid</i> of snakes.
aghast	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation. She winced <b>aghast</b> at his cruelty.
<u>amaze</u>	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. Your ability to speak six languages <b>amaze</b> s me.
amazed	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. She shook her head in <b>amazed</b> disbelief.
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. You never fail to <b>astonish</b> me.
<u>astonished</u>	Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed. We were <b>astonished</b> to hear of this decision.
<u>astonishing</u>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. Such an enormous response was <b>astonishing</b> .
astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>Astounded</i> viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing



<u>astounding</u>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone. He was <b>bemuse</b> d by what was happening.
blighted	Affected by blight; anything that mars or prevents growth or prosperity. A <b>blighted</b> rose.
<u>broken</u>	Out of working order busted is an informal substitute for broken. <i>Tear off the stub above the <b>broken</b> line.</i>
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. The <b>confused</b> information supplied by authorities.
destroyed	Destroyed physically or morally. Alzheimer s is responsible for her <b>destroyed</b> mind.
<u>dismayed</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>flabbergasted</u>	Greatly surprised or astonished. This news has left me totally <b>flabbergasted</b> .
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear. A <b>formidable</b> opponent.
irreparably	In a way that is impossible to rectify or repair. <i>Our international image has been <b>irreparably</b> tarnished.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i>The questioners were met with</i> <b>puzzled</b> <i>looks.</i>
quizzical	Amusingly odd or strange. One of the most <b>quizzical</b> movies ever made.
redoubtable	Inspiring fear. <i>He was a <b>redoubtable</b> debater.</i>
<u>revitalize</u>	Imbue (something) with new life and vitality. <i>This food <b>revitalize</b>d the patient.</i>
scared	Made afraid. He s <b>scared</b> to come to you and ask for help.
shock	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. All the jars and jolts were smoothed out by the <b>shock</b> absorbers.
<u>shocked</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>shocking</u>	Causing indignation or disgust; offensive. She brought <b>shocking</b> news.
<u>staggering</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. The <b>staggering</b> bills for maintenance and repair.



startled	Feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm. Students <b>startled</b> by the teacher s quiet return.
surprise	Cause to be surprised. Much to her <b>surprise</b> she d missed him.
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. There was a <b>surprised</b> silence.
