## Synonyms of "Shattered" as an adjective (17 Words)

**asleep on one's feet** Lacking sensation.

**debilitated** In a very weakened and infirm state.  
*I became very **debilitated** with tremendous joint pain.*

**distressed** Suffering severe physical strain or distress.  
*He dropped out of the race clearly **distressed** and having difficulty breathing.*

**dog-tired** Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted.

**drained** Drained of electric charge discharged.  
*A **drained** marsh.*

**enervated** Lacking energy or vitality.  
*Daniel felt too **enervated** to resist.*

**exhausted** Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted.  
***Exhausted** peat workings.*

**fatigued** Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted.

<b>fraught</b>	(of a situation or course of action) filled with or likely to result in (something undesirable. <i>Words <b>fraught</b> with meaning.</i>
<b>on one's last legs</b>	Conclusive in a process or progression.
<b>ready to drop</b>	Immediately available.
<b>spent</b>	Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted. <i>The movement has become a <b>spent</b> force.</i>
<b>tattered</b>	Ruined or disrupted. <i>A man in a <b>tattered</b> shirt.</i>
<b>tired out</b>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.
<b>upset</b>	Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief. <i>The Bills <b>upset</b> victory over the Houston Oilers.</i>
<b>weary</b>	Calling for a great amount of energy or endurance; tiring and tedious. <i>War <b>weary</b> Americans.</i>
<b>worried</b>	Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc. <i>Michelle knew that her friends were very <b>worried</b> about her.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Shattered" as an adjective

- *He was said to be absolutely shattered after losing his job.*
- *I usually feel too shattered to do more than crawl into bed.*
- *Our shattered dreams of peace and prosperity.*

- afraid** Worried that something undesirable will occur or be done.  
*Afraid of snakes.*
- aghast** Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.  
*She winced **aghast** at his cruelty.*
- amaze** Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment.  
*Your ability to speak six languages **amazes** me.*
- amazed** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
*She shook her head in **amazed** disbelief.*
- astonish** Surprise or impress (someone) greatly.  
*You never fail to **astonish** me.*
- astonished** Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed.  
*We were **astonished** to hear of this decision.*
- astonishing** Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing.  
*Such an enormous response was **astonishing**.*
- astounded** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
***Astounded** viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.*

<b><u>astounding</u></b>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
<b>bemuse</b>	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was <b>bemused</b> by what was happening.</i>
<b>blighted</b>	Affected by blight; anything that mars or prevents growth or prosperity. <i>A <b>blighted</b> rose.</i>
<b><u>broken</u></b>	Out of working order busted is an informal substitute for broken. <i>Tear off the stub above the <b>broken</b> line.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>The <b>confused</b> information supplied by authorities.</i>
<b>destroyed</b>	Destroyed physically or morally. <i>Alzheimer s is responsible for her <b>destroyed</b> mind.</i>
<b><u>dismayed</u></b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b><u>flabbergasted</u></b>	Greatly surprised or astonished. <i>This news has left me totally <b>flabbergasted</b>.</i>
<b><u>formidable</u></b>	Inspiring fear. <i>A <b>formidable</b> opponent.</i>
<b>irreparably</b>	In a way that is impossible to rectify or repair. <i>Our international image has been <b>irreparably</b> tarnished.</i>
<b><u>puzzled</u></b>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i>The questioners were met with <b>puzzled</b> looks.</i>
<b>quizzical</b>	Amusingly odd or strange. <i>One of the most <b>quizzical</b> movies ever made.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	Inspiring fear. <i>He was a <b>redoubtable</b> debater.</i>
<b><u>revitalize</u></b>	Imbue (something) with new life and vitality. <i>This food <b>revitalized</b> the patient.</i>
<b>scared</b>	Made afraid. <i>He s <b>scared</b> to come to you and ask for help.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. <i>All the jars and jolts were smoothed out by the <b>shock</b> absorbers.</i>
<b><u>shocked</u></b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b><u>shocking</u></b>	Causing indignation or disgust; offensive. <i>She brought <b>shocking</b> news.</i>
<b><u>staggering</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The <b>staggering</b> bills for maintenance and repair.</i>

**startled**

Feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm.  
*Students **startled** by the teacher's quiet return.*

**surprise**

Cause to be surprised.  
*Much to her **surprise** she'd missed him.*

**surprised**

Feeling or showing surprise.  
*There was a **surprised** silence.*
