<b>auroral</b>	Characteristic of the dawn. <i>A dim <b>auroral</b> glow.</i>
<b><a href="#">bask</a></b>	Revel in and make the most of (something pleasing). <i>He went on <b>basking</b> in the glory of his first book.</i>
<b><a href="#">beam</a></b>	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>The wide <b>beams</b> sprouted ten main tines.</i>
<b><a href="#">bright</a></b>	Not made dim or less bright. <i>These young people have a <b>bright</b> future ahead of them.</i>
<b>brilliance</b>	Unusual mental ability. <i>The nights were dark lit only by the <b>brilliance</b> of Aegean stars.</i>
<b>brilliantly</b>	With brightness. <i>He seems to be coping <b>brilliantly</b>.</i>
<b>emitter</b>	The region in a bipolar transistor that produces carriers of current. <i>Infrared <b>emitters</b>.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>A sudden thought <b>flashed</b> through his mind.</i>
<b><a href="#">gleam</a></b>	(of a smooth surface or object) reflect light because well polished. <i>Her eyes <b>gleamed</b> with satisfaction.</i>
<b>glimmer</b>	Shine faintly with a wavering light. <i>The moonlight <b>glimmered</b> on the lawn.</i>
<b>glint</b>	Give out or reflect small flashes of light. <i>She saw the <b>glint</b> of excitement in his eyes.</i>
<b>glisten</b>	The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>His cheeks <b>glistened</b> with tears.</i>
<b><a href="#">glitter</a></b>	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. <i>Sneakers trimmed with sequins and <b>glitter</b>.</i>

<b>glow</b>	A steady even light without flames. <i>He could feel the brandy filling him with a warm <b>glow</b>.</i>
<b>illuminate</b>	Help to clarify or explain. <i>A flash of lightning <b>illuminated</b> the house.</i>
<b>illumination</b>	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>These books form the most sustained analysis and <b>illumination</b> of the subject.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illuminated</b>.</i>
<b>lucent</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i>The moon was <b>lucent</b> in the background.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	The rate of emission of radiation, visible or otherwise. <i>Altair has ten times the <b>luminosity</b> of the sun.</i>
<b>phosphorescent</b>	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The <b>phosphorescent</b> glow of decaying wood.</i>
<b>radiant</b>	A radiant point. <i>He praised her <b>radiant</b> self confidence.</i>
<b>radiation</b>	Syndrome resulting from exposure to ionizing radiation e.g. exposure to radioactive chemicals or to nuclear explosions low doses cause diarrhea and nausea and vomiting and sometimes loss of hair greater exposure can cause sterility. <i>Background <b>radiation</b>.</i>
<b>ray</b>	Emit as rays. <i>Ultraviolet <b>rays</b>.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>His talent <b>shines</b>.</i>
<b>sparkle</b>	Be vivacious and witty. <i>Unquarried marble <b>sparkled</b> on the hillside.</i>
<b>spectroscopy</b>	The branch of science concerned with the investigation and measurement of spectra produced when matter interacts with or emits electromagnetic radiation.
<b>sunlight</b>	The rays of the sun. <i>A shaft of <b>sunlight</b>.</i>
<b>sunshine</b>	The quality of being cheerful and dispelling gloom. <i>Hand it over <b>sunshine</b>.</i>

**twinkle**

Merriment expressed by a brightness or gleam or animation of countenance.

*Does a constellation **twinkle** more brightly than a single star.*

**ultraviolet**

Of equipment or techniques using or concerned with ultraviolet radiation.

*An **ultraviolet** lamp.*
