auroral	Characteristic of the dawn. <i>A dim auroral glow.</i>
bask	Revel in and make the most of (something pleasing). <i>He went on basking in the glory of his first book.</i>
beam	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>The wide beams sprouted ten main tines.</i>
bright	Not made dim or less bright. <i>These young people have a bright future ahead of them.</i>
brilliance	Unusual mental ability. <i>The nights were dark lit only by the brilliance of Aegean stars.</i>
brilliantly	With brightness. <i>He seems to be coping brilliantly.</i>
emitter	The region in a bipolar transistor that produces carriers of current. <i>Infrared emitters.</i>
flash	A newsflash. <i>A sudden thought flashed through his mind.</i>
gleam	(of a smooth surface or object) reflect light because well polished. <i>Her eyes gleamed with satisfaction.</i>
glimmer	Shine faintly with a wavering light. <i>The moonlight glimmered on the lawn.</i>
glint	Give out or reflect small flashes of light. <i>She saw the glint of excitement in his eyes.</i>
glisten	The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>His cheeks glistened with tears.</i>
glitter	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. <i>Sneakers trimmed with sequins and glitter.</i>

glow	A steady even light without flames. <i>He could feel the brandy filling him with a warm glow.</i>
illuminate	Help to clarify or explain. <i>A flash of lightning illuminated the house.</i>
illumination	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>These books form the most sustained analysis and illumination of the subject.</i>
illumine	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illumined.</i>
lucent	Softly bright or radiant. <i>The moon was lucent in the background.</i>
luminosity	The rate of emission of radiation, visible or otherwise. <i>Altair has ten times the luminosity of the sun.</i>
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The phosphorescent glow of decaying wood.</i>
radiant	A radiant point. <i>He praised her radiant self confidence.</i>
radiation	Syndrome resulting from exposure to ionizing radiation e.g exposure to radioactive chemicals or to nuclear explosions low doses cause diarrhea and nausea and vomiting and sometimes loss of hair greater exposure can cause sterility. <i>Background radiation.</i>
ray	Emit as rays. <i>Ultraviolet rays.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>His talent shines.</i>
sparkle	Be vivacious and witty. <i>Unquarried marble sparkled on the hillside.</i>
spectroscopy	The branch of science concerned with the investigation and measurement of spectra produced when matter interacts with or emits electromagnetic radiation.
sunlight	The rays of the sun. <i>A shaft of sunlight.</i>
sunshine	The quality of being cheerful and dispelling gloom. <i>Hand it over sunshine.</i>

twinkle

Merriment expressed by a brightness or gleam or animation of countenance.

*Does a constellation **twinkle** more brightly than a single star.*

ultraviolet

Of equipment or techniques using or concerned with ultraviolet radiation.

*An **ultraviolet** lamp.*
