## Associations of "Shed light" (30 Words)

<b>auroral</b>	Of or relating to the atmospheric phenomenon auroras. <i>A dim <b>auroral</b> glow.</i>
<b><a href="#">bask</a></b>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>She relished her fame and <b>basked</b> in her glory.</i>
<b><a href="#">beam</a></b>	An oscillating shaft which transmits the vertical piston movement of a beam engine to the crank or pump. <i>The watertight skin and deck were put on over this framework of ribs and <b>beams</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">bright</a></b>	Brightly. <i>A <b>bright</b> idea.</i>
<b>brilliance</b>	The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand. <i>The nights were dark lit only by the <b>brilliance</b> of Aegean stars.</i>
<b>brilliantly</b>	In an impressive or outstanding way; very well. <i>She succeeded <b>brilliantly</b>.</i>
<b>emitter</b>	A thing which emits something. <i>The country's largest <b>emitter</b> of airborne toxins.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>The oncoming car <b>flashed</b> its lights.</i>
<b><a href="#">gleam</a></b>	(of an emotion or quality) be expressed through the brightness of a person's eyes. <i>Light <b>gleamed</b> on the china cats.</i>
<b>glimmer</b>	Shine brightly, like a star or a light. <i>There is one <b>glimmer</b> of hope for Becky.</i>
<b>glint</b>	Be shiny, as if wet. <i>The <b>glint</b> of gold in his teeth.</i>
<b>glisten</b>	A sparkling light reflected from something wet. <i>His cheeks <b>glistened</b> with tears.</i>

<b>glitter</b>	Be shiny, as if wet. <i>The grass <b>glittered</b> with dew.</i>
<b>glow</b>	Be exuberant or high-spirited. <i>The fireflies were <b>glowing</b> and flying about in the garden.</i>
<b>illuminate</b>	Make free from confusion or ambiguity; make clear. <i>Placing the events of the 1930s in a broader historical context helps to <b>illuminate</b> their significance.</i>
<b>illumination</b>	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of <b>illumination</b> are needed for reading.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illuminated</b>.</i>
<b>lucent</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i>The moon was <b>lucent</b> in the background.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	The quality of being luminous; emitting or reflecting light. <i>Its <b>luminosity</b> is measured relative to that of our sun.</i>
<b>phosphorescent</b>	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The <b>phosphorescent</b> glow of decaying wood.</i>
<b>radiant</b>	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>Plants convert the <b>radiant</b> energy of the sun into chemical energy.</i>
<b>radiation</b>	Syndrom resulting from exposure to ionizing radiation e g exposure to radioactive chemicals or to nuclear explosions low doses cause diarrhea and nausea and vomiting and sometimes loss of hair greater exposure can cause sterility. <i>The <b>radiation</b> dose.</i>
<b>ray</b>	Emit as rays. <i>A <b>ray</b> of sunlight came through the window.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>His shoes were <b>shined</b> to perfection.</i>
<b>sparkle</b>	Vivacity and wit. <i>She s got a kind of <b>sparkle</b>.</i>
<b>spectroscopy</b>	The use of spectrosopes to analyze spectra.
<b>sunlight</b>	The rays of the sun. <i>A shaft of <b>sunlight</b>.</i>
<b>sunshine</b>	Used as a friendly or sometimes threatening form of address. <i>Their colourful music can bring a ray of <b>sunshine</b>.</i>

Gleam or glow intermittently.

*The smile made her face crease and her eyes **twinkle**.*

**ultraviolet**

Of equipment or techniques using or concerned with ultraviolet radiation.

*An **ultraviolet** lamp.*
