<b>auroral</b>	Of or relating to the atmospheric phenomenon auroras. <i>A dim <b>auroral</b> glow.</i>
<b><a href="#">bask</a></b>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>The seals came ashore to breed and to <b>bask</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">beam</a></b>	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>There was land in sight on the port <b>beam</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">bright</a></b>	Brightly. <i>The room was <b>bright</b> and airy.</i>
<b>brilliance</b>	A light within the field of vision that is brighter than the brightness to which the eyes are adapted. <i>He s played the stock market with great <b>brilliance</b>.</i>
<b>brilliantly</b>	With brightness. <i>This fight was <b>brilliantly</b> choreographed.</i>
<b>emitter</b>	The region in a bipolar transistor that produces carriers of current. <i>Infrared <b>emitters</b>.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>The woodpecker swooped from tree to tree with a <b>flash</b> of yellow green and red.</i>
<b><a href="#">gleam</a></b>	An expression of an emotion or quality in a person’s eyes. <i>Victor buffed the glass until it <b>gleamed</b>.</i>
<b>glimmer</b>	A flash of light (especially reflected light). <i>The moonlight <b>glimmered</b> on the lawn.</i>
<b>glint</b>	A momentary flash of light. <i>She saw the <b>glint</b> of excitement in his eyes.</i>
<b>glisten</b>	The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>His cheeks <b>glistened</b> with tears.</i>

<b>glitter</b>	An attractive and exciting but superficial quality. <i>The grass <b>glittered</b> with dew.</i>
<b>glow</b>	An alert and refreshed state. <i>Katy always <b>glowed</b> when he praised her.</i>
<b>illuminate</b>	Help to clarify or explain. <i>A flash of lightning <b>illuminated</b> the house.</i>
<b>illumination</b>	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>These books form the most sustained analysis and <b>illumination</b> of the subject.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Make lighter or brighter. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illumined</b>.</i>
<b>lucent</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i>The moon was <b>lucent</b> in the background.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	Luminous quality. <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and <b>luminosity</b>.</i>
<b>phosphorescent</b>	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The <b>phosphorescent</b> glow of decaying wood.</i>
<b>radiant</b>	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>She gave him a <b>radiant</b> smile.</i>
<b>radiation</b>	Syndrome resulting from exposure to ionizing radiation e.g. exposure to radioactive chemicals or to nuclear explosions low doses cause diarrhea and nausea and vomiting and sometimes loss of hair greater exposure can cause sterility. <i>Background <b>radiation</b>.</i>
<b>ray</b>	Emit as rays. <i>The sun <b>rays</b> forth its natural light into the air.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>Tonight he will have a chance to <b>shine</b> and win a world boxing title.</i>
<b>sparkle</b>	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. <i>She's got a kind of <b>sparkle</b>.</i>
<b>spectroscopy</b>	The use of spectrometers to analyze spectra.
<b>sunlight</b>	The rays of the sun. <i>A shaft of <b>sunlight</b>.</i>
<b>sunshine</b>	The rays of the sun. <i>Their colourful music can bring a ray of <b>sunshine</b>.</i>

A sparkle or gleam in a person's eyes.  
*The distant **twinkle** of the lights.*

**ultraviolet**
