<u>beam</u>	Express with a beaming face or smile. There was land in sight on the port <b>beam</b> .
<u>bright</u>	Brightly. The room was <b>bright</b> and airy.
brilliance	A light within the field of vision that is brighter than the brightness to which the eyes are adapted. He s played the stock market with great <b>brilliance</b> .
brilliantly	With brightness. This fight was <b>brilliantly</b> choreographed.
emitter	The region in a bipolar transistor that produces carriers of current. Infrared <b>emitter</b> s.
flash	A newsflash. The woodpecker swooped from tree to tree with a <b>flash</b> of yellow green and red.
<u>gleam</u>	An expression of an emotion or quality in a person's eyes. <i>Victor buffed the glass until it <b>gleam</b>ed.</i>
glimmer	A flash of light (especially reflected light. The moonlight <b>glimmer</b> ed on the lawn.
glint	A momentary flash of light. She saw the <b>glint</b> of excitement in his eyes.
glisten	The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>His cheeks <b>glisten</b>ed with tears.</i>



<u>glitter</u>	An attractive and exciting but superficial quality. <i>The grass <b>glitter</b>ed with dew.</i>
glow	An alert and refreshed state. Katy always <b>glow</b> ed when he praised her.
illuminate	Help to clarify or explain. A flash of lightning <b>illuminate</b> d the house.
illumination	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. These books form the most sustained analysis and <b>illumination</b> of the subject.
illumine	Make lighter or brighter. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illumine</b>d.</i>
lucent	Softly bright or radiant. The moon was <b>lucent</b> in the background.
luminosity	Luminous quality. Acrylic colours retain freshness and <b>luminosity</b> .
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The <b>phosphorescent</b> glow of decaying wood.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. She gave him a <b>radiant</b> smile.
radiation	Syndrome resulting from exposure to ionizing radiation e g exposure to radioactive chemicals or to nuclear explosions low doses cause diarrhea and nausea and vomiting and sometimes loss of hair greater exposure can cause sterility. Background <b>radiation</b> .
ray	Emit as rays. The sun <b>ray</b> s forth its natural light into the air.
shine	Make a surface shine. Tonight he will have a chance to <b>shine</b> and win a world boxing title.
<u>sparkle</u>	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. She s got a kind of <b>sparkle</b> .
spectroscopy	The use of spectroscopes to analyze spectra.
sunlight	The rays of the sun. A shaft of <b>sunlight</b> .
sunshine	The rays of the sun. Their colourful music can bring a ray of <b>sunshine</b> .
