auroral	Of or relating to the atmospheric phenomenon auroras. <i>A dim auroral glow.</i>
bask	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>The seals came ashore to breed and to bask.</i>
beam	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>There was land in sight on the port beam.</i>
bright	Brightly. <i>The room was bright and airy.</i>
brilliance	A light within the field of vision that is brighter than the brightness to which the eyes are adapted. <i>He s played the stock market with great brilliance.</i>
brilliantly	With brightness. <i>This fight was brilliantly choreographed.</i>
emitter	The region in a bipolar transistor that produces carriers of current. <i>Infrared emitters.</i>
flash	A newsflash. <i>The woodpecker swooped from tree to tree with a flash of yellow green and red.</i>
gleam	An expression of an emotion or quality in a person's eyes. <i>Victor buffed the glass until it gleamed.</i>
glimmer	A flash of light (especially reflected light). <i>The moonlight glimmered on the lawn.</i>
glint	A momentary flash of light. <i>She saw the glint of excitement in his eyes.</i>
glisten	The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>His cheeks glistened with tears.</i>

glitter	An attractive and exciting but superficial quality. <i>The grass glittered with dew.</i>
glow	An alert and refreshed state. <i>Katy always glowed when he praised her.</i>
illuminate	Help to clarify or explain. <i>A flash of lightning illuminated the house.</i>
illumination	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>These books form the most sustained analysis and illumination of the subject.</i>
illumine	Make lighter or brighter. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
lucent	Softly bright or radiant. <i>The moon was lucent in the background.</i>
luminosity	Luminous quality. <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and luminosity.</i>
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The phosphorescent glow of decaying wood.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>She gave him a radiant smile.</i>
radiation	Syndrome resulting from exposure to ionizing radiation e.g. exposure to radioactive chemicals or to nuclear explosions low doses cause diarrhea and nausea and vomiting and sometimes loss of hair greater exposure can cause sterility. <i>Background radiation.</i>
ray	Emit as rays. <i>The sun rays forth its natural light into the air.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>Tonight he will have a chance to shine and win a world boxing title.</i>
sparkle	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. <i>She's got a kind of sparkle.</i>
spectroscopy	The use of spectrometers to analyze spectra.
sunlight	The rays of the sun. <i>A shaft of sunlight.</i>
sunshine	The rays of the sun. <i>Their colourful music can bring a ray of sunshine.</i>

A sparkle or gleam in a person's eyes.
