- A flat length of wood or other rigid material, attached to a wall or forming part of a piece of furniture, that provides a surface for the storage or display of objects.
- A support that consists of a horizontal surface for holding objects.
- A projecting ridge on a mountain or submerged under water.

ledge A window ledge.

reef A submerged ridge of rock or coral near the surface of the water.

sandbank A submerged bank of sand near a shore or in a river; can be exposed at low

tide.



shoal A large number of people or things.

Shoals of people were coming up the drive.

sill A flat (usually horizontal) mass of igneous rock between two layers of older

sedimentary rock.

space The unlimited expanse in which everything is located.

A piece of furniture with tableware for a meal laid out on it.

unoccupied Not leased to or occupied by a tenant.

volume A scroll of parchment or papyrus containing written matter.
